## Freshmen oppose nonresident fee raise

A bill to raise nonresident and foreign student tuition in state schools to a minumum of $\$ 700$ was approved by the
Texas House and sent to the Senate Wednesday, according to UPI sources. The Freshman Council sponsored a petition urging the Texas State egislature not to pass this proposed ncrease. Tables were set up in the

nonresident fees were set by the legislature in 1957. The proposed bill

THE FRESHMAN COUNCLL lists the
following reasons for opposing this tuition increase:

1. Since many nonresident students will not be able to afford these increases, university population of Texas. 2. Because of the decrease in college population, there will also be a decrease in income to the state. This deficit,

raising other fees for resident students. 3. Local merchants and businessmen will suffer financially.

More than 19,000 nonresident and foreign students who annually attend Texas colleges and universities,
representing about seven per cent of the representing about seven per cent of th
total student population, would be af total student population, would be
fected by the bill, according to UPI. Robert Burnett, director of in-
ternational student services, said, "If they are going to raise nonresiden tuition, resident tuition should be raised proportionally. They would get a greater
amount of revenue by raising resident tuition $\$ 25$ or $\$ 30$."
He said the university would run the
risk of stagnating then
only Texas students.
"You need an interchange of ideas among foreign, out-of-state and in-state tudents," said Burnett.

HE SAID THERE will probably be a drop in enrollment of international
students in Texas if the measure passes. If students had the choice of going to Tech or to Berkeley for the same price, hey would probably choose Berkeley."
"Tuition is very low and could be aised," he said, "To raise it so abruptly, though, wouldn't be logical.

## Planned Parenthood

## welcomes Techsans

By JULIE McCABE Planned Parenthood sees a lot of Tech students, said Mrs. Gwyn Vail when she and Jim Roderick talked to members of the Ecological Task Force Tuesday night. "They're perfectly welcome," she said. "We're glad to have them." Roderick is the administrative
assistant for the HEW grant for family assistant for the HEW grant for family
planning and the director of Planned planning and the director of Planned
Parenthood. Mrs. Vail is a case worker for HEW Family Planning. Roderick said one of the main functions of the Planned Parenthood Association is and refer people to doctors for variou and refer people to doctors for various
types of contraceptives and examinations.
He also said Planned Parenthood, because it is a government agency,
cannot turn anyone away, regardless of cannot turn anyone away, regardless of near future, they hope to be able to initiate an educational program aimed at affluent people. Last year alone, he said, there were over 450,000 unwanted pregnancies among affluent families.
Cindy O'Brian, chairman of the Eco

Task Force, referred to these people as the silent majority, knowing about sex and birth control, but not talking about it Roderick said another phase of the educational program would be to use a problem of sex education, by calling the course School Population Educational Problems.
Mrs. Vail's job includes working with sirls aged 18-20. This includes Tech girls' medication can be given to a girl under 18 without parental consent.
without parental consent.
She said she is very interested in She said she is very interested in
working more closely with the university and the student health service. She said she thinks she can make them aware that birth control information is needed by showing them some of the figures from
her files. Monday, she said, she saw her files. Monday, she said, she saw
seven Tech students for birth control pills and two seeking abortions.
Roderick said that, although they have facilities to see about 2,500 women a year and there are about 6,500 below the poverty level that need the services, they
are going to wage a campaign to make hemselves known The Committee on The Committee on Clubs and
Organizations will work to project the Planned Parenthood plan through these various agencies.
While Mrs. Vail
While Mrs. Vail said she never forces the two child family theory on anyone,
Roderick said, "Planned Parenthood's national policy is to encourage only two children per family.
Planned Parenthood works with the Public Health Department and the Child Welfare Department. Since every woman gaining birth control devices examination, including blood tests which are analyzed by the health department, often infections such as venerial disease are detected and treatment follows. If a
girl comes the clinic, is found to be girl comes the clinic, is found to be
pregnant, but does not plan to get pregnant, but does not plan to get
married or have an abortion, Mrs. Vail can refer her to maternity homes, foster homes or the Child Welfare Department if she wishes to place the baby up for adoption.

discriminately admitted discriminately admitted and

accepted. Above-average
marks are essential and the equivalent of an " $A$ " average is

mission.
Substantiating this is the fact that the accumulative gradepoint average of international students who have completed
one or more semesters at Tech, generally averages between one
half and one point higher then the all-college average. Scholarships available to
international students which international students which
are administered by Texas
Tech are limited to two. The

The man was John Maynard Keynes, later to be made a lord. The book, "The General Theory
of Employment, Interest and Money." He is the man with
whom President Nixon, to the surprise of
himself.

through supply and demand. through supply and demand. Keynes felt full employment
demanded a more activist government. It could be
achieved, he felt, only if the government and the central bank deliberately encourage

since 1946 , Keynes is today perhaps the most influentia
