PLYING eggs, flowing blood, flailing fists, and sailing rocks characterized the scene on State Highway No. 1 near Abilene Saturday. The Hardin-Simmons football squad—or at least a large part of it—was attacking the Texas Tech Matador band.

It is impossible, however, for even Hardin-Simmons students to have such a warped point of view. They knew the Matador band was concluding a West Texas good will tour. They knew that Tech students would have no object in laboring all night to move a piece of field artillery to a neighboring campus.

WHAT, then, was their object? This question has been asked many times on Tech campus this week. Even ten years of heated rivalry and eventual severance of athletic relations this year do not account for the unsportsmanlike occurrence. The Abilene puglists could have had only one purpose—to humiliate a seemingly defenseless delegation from what they consider a rival school. The Matador musicians are to be congratulated upon their powers of endurance when insults were added to insults during their stay in Abilene, and upon their noble retaliation after such inhumane treatment.

The Toreador realizes that the belligerent minority does not represent Hardin-Simmons university. That minority is a group which would be undesirable in any institution, and the Administration of the Abilene school is to be commended if the boys go, ridiculed if they stay.

As far as The Toreador can ascertain, there is no plan of retaliation from Tech students, and this seems to be an opportune time to sever all relations with a school whose interests and ideals are incompatible with those of Texas Tech.

The Same Story Again!

IT all goes back to the same old story-lack of adequate facilities to keep par

lack of adequate facilities to keep pace with its rapid growth.

Again last week students and all persons interested (that excludes some of the legislators!) in the institution saw this situation keep the college from securing a feature attraction in Big Bill Tilden and his troupe of professional tennis players. When one of the greatest tennis players that ever stepped on a court wired the cancellation of his contract, the very words he used holds a message for every member of the state legislature who persist in nodding negatively to the appropriation of money for the state's "fastest growing college." Space to small, said Tilden. That statement shows the need for a modern gym to replace the "barn" that stands out as a reproach to the school.

If only the legislature members could take the places of students for a short time. Then they would see for themselves the deplorable conditions under which the school operates. During this period, as students, they would visit a crowded library probably waiting for some time before being able to secure a book because of the congested condition. Then, after vainly searching for a seat in the "crackerbox" room, the legislator would take his seat on the steps or in a chair in the hall where people were constantly passing. Here as he attempted to digest some difficult matter maybe something would cause him to realize how badly Tech needs a library.
