FOR several years the women of the col

FOR several years the women of the college have held a recognition service each spring to honor those coeds who have been oustanding in their respective fields. This service has done much to make sure that those women who have done worthwhile work for the college get public credit for their activities.

Until this time, there has been no similar way in which college men could receive credit for beneficial work they have done. Leaders of the YMCA have conceived and suggested a plan by which such a service may be provided for, and its realization lies now in the hands of the administrative heads of the college. Those students who perceived the need for such recognition are to be commended for their insight into the necessities of the institution, and it is hoped that college authorities react favorably to the plans.

Of course, it will be necessary that students have a great part in selection and functions of the service, because it will come at a time when faculty members are at their busiest. Those who forward the plans must be sensible in their decisions. In the first place, the ceremony must be entirely masculine; methods of selection of candidates for recognition must be such that no person who is not red-blooded and loyal to the college may obtain recognition.

Further, actual grades should be a very small determining factor. If it just happens that those men whose work has evidently been most valuable to the college have a high scholastic standing, well and good, but no man should be chosen for the honors just because he has an A average. The typical bookworm is NOT indicative of Texas Tech. The men recognized should be stalwart representatives of twentieth century American manhood, physical, morally and mentally.


