

Campus Paving Project Has Completion Funds

At last ofter two years of delay, funds are available for completing the paving project in front of the engineering building and the gymnasium.

Started in the fall of 1935 as a part of the national WPA program, construction was halted after a brief time because of lack of funds. The curbs had been constructed and caliche had been deposited over the road bed.

Every few weeks a crew of men came out and worked on the project in attempts to keep it in shape. This entailed an enormous wastage of labor and money. It seems that almost enough money was spent in upkeep of the unfinished job to complete the entire project.

Just where the accusing finger should be pointed is difficult to determine. So much "red tape" is involved in the WPA set-up as a whole that responsibility cannot be placed readily.

It seems that in the future such pro-jects should not be begun until adequate funds are available to complete the work. Already over-burdened tax payers could be saved a large sum of money under this
