REGARDING SOCIAL ACTIVITY

According to a recent ruling of the social activities' committee, Tech social clubs will not be bothered with a two weeks' period of frenzied "rushing" of prospective members. Instead of rushing possible club assets, the clubs will be allowed to pledge new members by mid-semester only if the mid-semester reports show that the prospective member has not been reported failing in any subject or being unsatisfactory in as many as two subjects.

Another ruling is to the effect that a club cannot pledge prospects, if, during the preceding semester, the club has not made an average of "C" or better per member with each member carrying an average of twelve hours.

The Toreador believes that these new regulations have been needed for a long time. All too often, students come to college with the idea that the side-show is the important thing and that grades are necessary evils; that merely getting by is sufficient. In this day, old ideas are being discarded and new ones substituted, a very desirable thing provided the new ideas are found to be worthy. It is to be regretted that the old idea that a "C" is a gentleman's grade has still sufficient influence to cause this grade to be used as a standard.

The Toreador has no quarrel with social clubs but it does regret that the grade could not have been a little higher and that an element of social service could not have been made one of the major aims of the present organizations as it is in the Forum or that a little serious effort and work on the part of the clubs to better themselves and to be of a more well rounded worth to their members be a part of the new plans.


