The natural rivalry that would of necessity spring up between Texas, A&M and Tech would, we believe, shortly become a top drawing card. Even now, unenhanced by Southwest conference prestige, Tech at home will draw crowds that will equal those of Rice, A&M and Baylor at home.

Tech's domination of the Border conference in recent years indicates to us that the school has outgrown its present grid circuit and its showing against topflight Southwest conference teams the past three years shows that it would not be a perennial cellar dweller. Interest is expanding in minor sports such as tennis, golf, fencing and bowling and there is increased activity in intramurals. The school's basketball squads, which always dip liberally into SWC territory, have never given opponents opportunity to complain about lack of competition. And the new stadium at last furnishes Tech with adequate plant facilities to handle SWC membership. What it lacks would no doubt be added in a blaze of enthusiasm if the school were admitted.

It's Divisions of Agriculture and Engineering are known to be outstanding and are recognized and respected all over the nation. A minor indication of excellence are the Aggie judging teams, which this year seem always to have the habit of coming out one step ahead of Texas A&M's teams. There is no doubt that Tech is already the educational capitol of the



great expanse known as West Texas, and that the school, surrounded by a rich agricultural area, has the greatest potential for progress of any school in the state or this part of the country.

Certainly graduates of Southwest conference schools who live in the plains area would find great satisfaction in a decision for Tech's admittance into the big time loop. It would give them an opportunity to see their old school's grid machines in action more than once a decade.

Of course the SWC has a lot to offer Tech in the way of prestige and better competition. Tech, on the other hand would give much more than it would receive.




