Time for the long heralded release of the Tech movie is now upon us. Like most other studeths, we're going to see the picture for the first time Monday night. Just what to expect might be indicated by reviewing the circumstances under which the movie was produced.

Common sense tells us we cannot expect a production with the finish or finesse of Hollywood. "Futures Unlimited" is a student production even down to the narration of the story. This story is not one with plot, but relates, on a rather formal plane, the story of the school and its great potentialities. It covers everything from football games to formal dances with background music played by the Matador band.

Thirty-two minutes of Texas Tech presented in color and with a view of selling the school to the whole Southwest is what students will see in "Futures Unlimited" at the Monday night premiere. All too few of the students will be able to see themselves in action due to limitations in film length, but most will probably see many of their friends.

No one of the six thousand students at Tech should miss the movie. There is reason beyond the personal enjoyment he is sure to get if he attends. The small entrance fee charged will make possible the purchase of additional pictures for distribution throughout the state and assure the success of the program. An effort has been made to schedule sufficient showings so that every student can see the picture at a convenient time. Now an effort to attend, on the part of each individual, is in order.

One point to remember: Your future, to a large extent depends on he reputation of the school from which you graduate. Effective publicity for Tech, such as this picture offfers, is a big step toward making both the future of the Tech graduate and the school Unlimited.


