Three juveniles were charged late last week with a 'criminal mischief spree from the previous weekend.

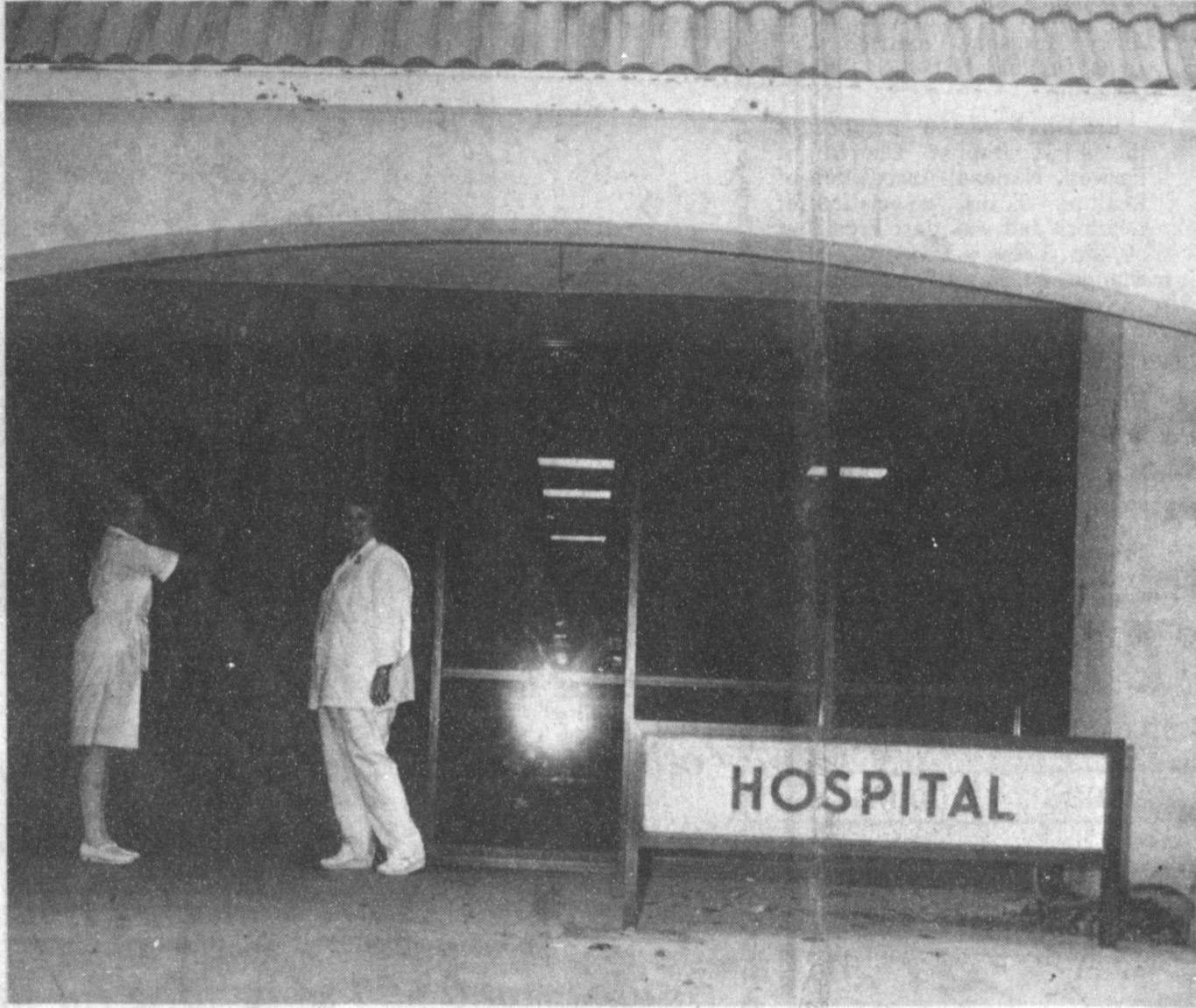

Construction Has Started On New All-Weather Track

Construction has already started on a new track facility for the Muleshoe ISD, according to Tom Jinks, assistant superintendent for business and finance. Jinks said the construction will be completed in approximately 150 days.

Jinks added that the school board approved the construction of the new facility after much deliberation and planning. Planning for the facility began in 1981 when the school district became 'debt free.'

Since that time, the trustees have met new construction and renovation needs on a 'pay as you go plan,' explained Jinks. A priority list was established and has continued to be the guiding force for meeting the needs of the district, added the assistant superintendent.

He reminded that the track facility was near the bottom of the priority list four years ago and has gradually moved to a position on the list where it could be considered. The bid of the new facility was awarded to Vibra-Whirl of Panhandle; however, several local sub-contractors are being utilized and according to the contractor, a significant amount of temporary

local labor will be used in the project.

Murder Suspect Captured

In August, one of the largest manhunts to ever be conducted in Bailey and Parmer Counties was undertaken following a fatal shooting six miles west of Bovina.

Subject of the manhunt, Rene Garcia, 22, of Muleshoe, was captured Thursday morning in Immokalee, Fla. following an anonymous tip to authorities.

Garcia is charged with capital murder, aggravated assault, aggravated kidnapping and unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, following the early morning shooting on August 3, that fatally wounded Christy Sotelo, 25, and left Tonya Parkinson with a bullet wound.

Two other occupants of the vehicle escaped into the darkness, and Garcia reportedly kidnapped Ida Sotelo, 17, at gunpoint.

He also allegedly took the Sotelo's late model Buick. The car was found near New Orleans, La. in a wooded area. It had been burned.

Parmer County Sheriff Bill Morgan said he had talked to Ida Sotelo following the apprehension of Garcia, "and she was fine."

Sheriff Morgan said Garcia signed a waiver Friday morning, and he is expected to be brought back in approximately two weeks.

Emergency Clinic Open For Business

Following the closing of West Plains Medical Center in-patient service on Tuesday morning, and closing of the WPMC emergency room services on Thursday afternoon, the four local doctors decided to open a minor emergency clinic.

Muleshoe Outpatient After Hours Clinic opened at the Family Medicine Clinic at 701 South First Street on Friday evening, telephone 272-7531.

Drs. Bruce Purdy, Homer Allgood, Henry Muyschondt and Jack McCarty will be on a rotation basis for emergencies going into the clinic. On duty during open hours will be a receptionist and a nurse, with a lab technician and x-ray technician on call.

Fees for the clinic will be \$30 for the clinic, plus the doctor's charge, and lab and x-ray fees, if necessary. All services will be provided on a cash basis.

The new emergency clinic will be open 6-11 p.m. on week-nights and 1-9 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. After those hours, patients will be required to go to an out-of-town hospital for treatment.

Dr. Purdy said these services are being provided for only minor emergencies, as the clinic is not equipped for major emergencies, such as heart attacks, strokes, traumas or from major accidents.

In the event of a major emergency, the doctors suggest calling an ambulance, who will transport the patient to the nearest hospital.

As Bailey County took over operation of the ambulance service on September 15, there has been no interruption of ambulance service from Muleshoe. If you need an ambulance, call 272-4200 and an ambulance will be dispatched immediately.

Remaining open on the premises of West Plains Medical Center at presstime are the clinic, with Drs. Homer Allgood, Henry Muyschondt and Jack McCarty, and the Muleshoe Nursing Home.

At 11:30 a.m. on Friday, Richard McLarney, acting administrator of the West Plains Medical Center for Westworld Community Healthcare of Texas Inc. ordered Claude 'Pudge' Rose to lock the pharmacy that it is 'now closed down.' Rose said all records from the pharmacy have been moved to Western Drug for safekeeping in the interim.

chambers' overflowing, local businesses were signing up for the promotion, joining the 35 businesses who had already signed up to participate in the promotion.

It's all very simple, explained Bob Donaldson, of the Muleshoe Activities Committee. Each business who signs up at a cost of \$10 per month, to assure prize money for the monthly drawings, will be given a roll of tickets. Shoppers will be given one ticket for each \$5 spent with their particular business.

The shopper keeps one-half of the ticket, while the other half is deposited in a box in the participating store or business.

On the first Saturday of each month, all the tickets from each business will be placed in a hopper, and three tickets will be drawn. Winners of the drawings must be present to win either \$100, \$75 or \$25.

Winners of the three drawings, if they are present when their number is called, is given their corresponding prize in 'MAC Bucks' which may be spent like cash at any business in Muleshoe.

The MAC Bucks may be used to pay utility bills, insurance, buy groceries, clothing, gasoline, or spent in any manner in Muleshoe, such as eating out, buying gifts, because they are as 'Good as Gold,' explained Donaldson to the group that more than filled the city hall.

A purchase must equal the MAC Buck or be more, as they may not be exchanged for cash. Businesses who have MAC Bucks spent with them will in turn, redeem the MAC Bucks for cash at the Chamber of Commerce office at the city hall.

Donaldson also said the MAC Buck promotion is expected to draw a significant number of people from the surrounding area to Muleshoe to spend their shopping dollars, thus aiding Muleshoe's economy.

An added enhancement will be two special drawings each year. The first drawing will be on July 4. To be given away will be one-half of the money in the

Jerry Bradshaw Services Saturday In Farwell

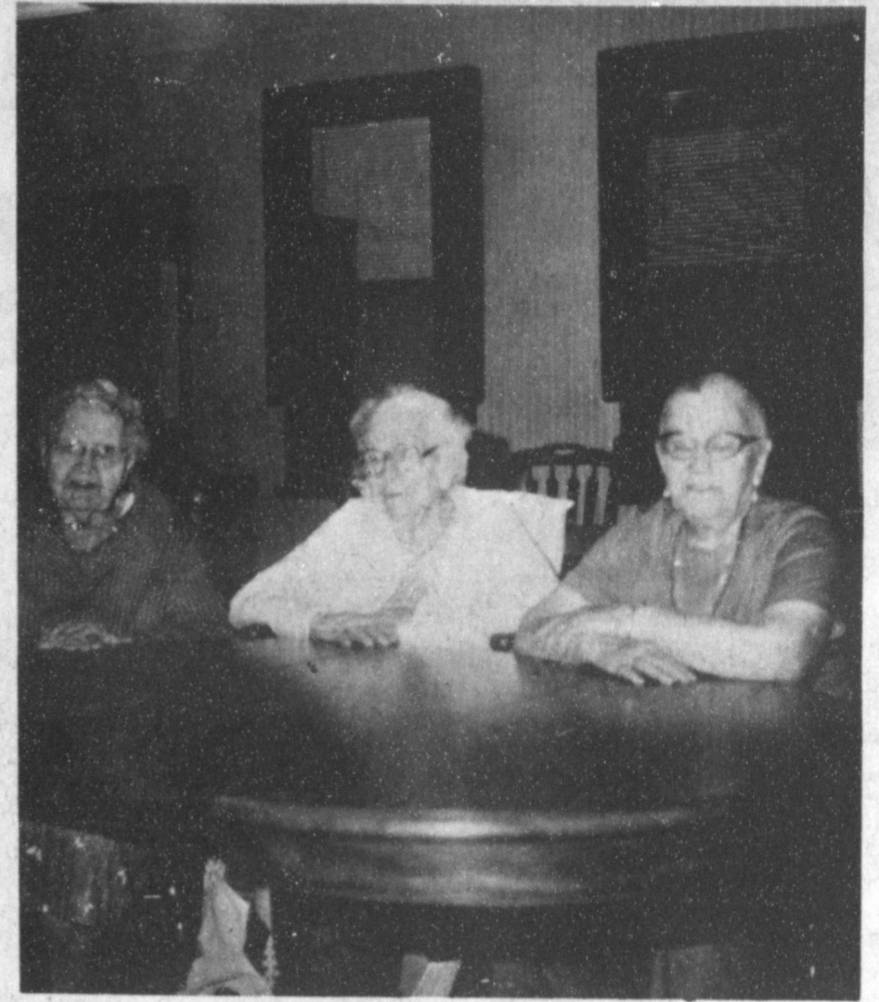

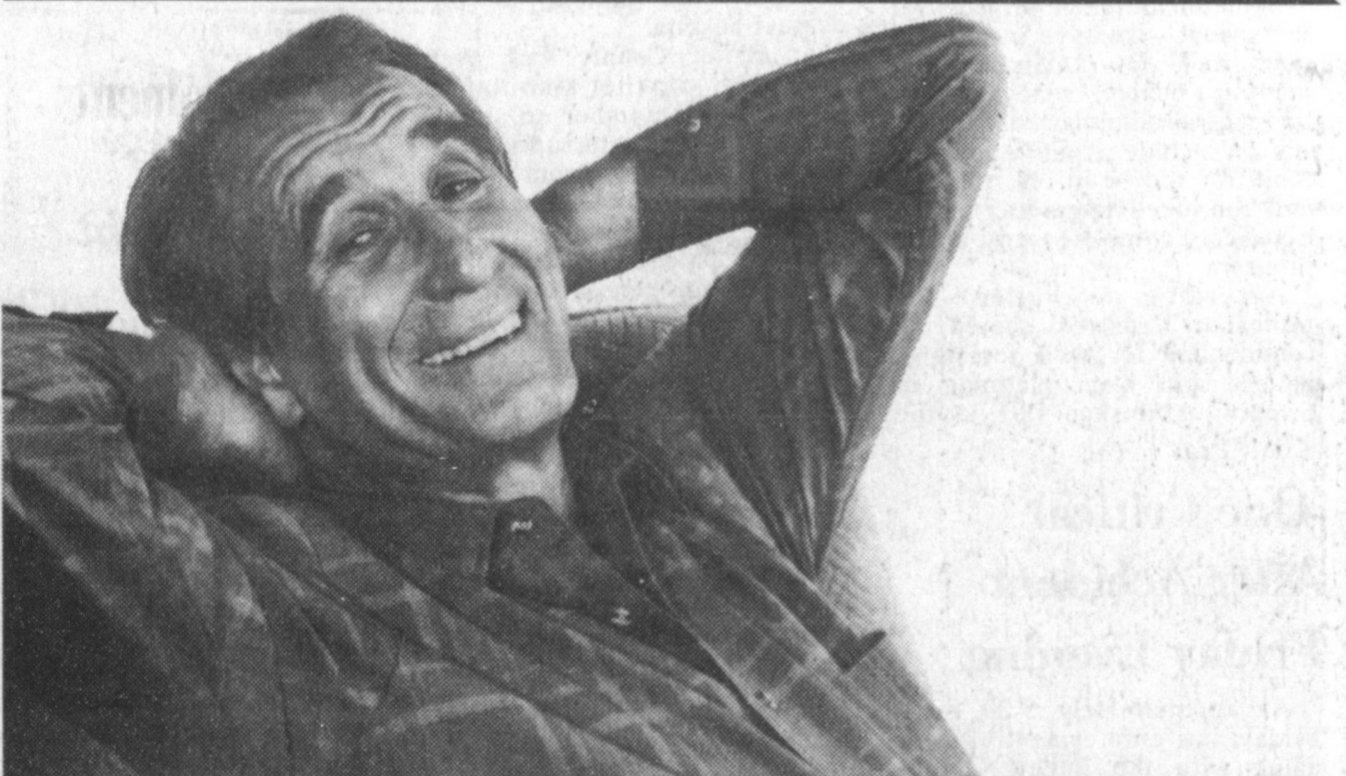

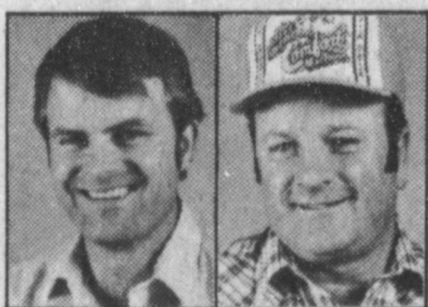
