### San Francisco Conference

THE San Frachisco Conference is now in session with delegates from countries the world over debating on the policies that are to direct nations. The vast importance of this meeting uppermost in the minds of people everywhere, is being discussed in barber chairs, on buses, on street corners and in classrooms. Despite the fact that since the death of our late president, people have been told continuously that our foreign policies may be expected to go on unchanged, there is an element of anticipation prevalent among the people of the United States today.

The Golden Gate conference has two primary functinos: To eliminate war as a tool of national policy and to lay the plan and begin the structure of an international organization. The accomplishment of these two aims has been greatly facilitated by the principles laid down at the Yalta conference, which in turn is directly connected with the Atlantic Charter.

One of the chief issues to be settled is that of the duo claims of Russia and Poland. Polish nationalists claim all of the territory which was granted to Poland by the Bolshevik government in 1921. The territory was gained in the settlement after the Polish victory over the Bolshevik armies. Closely allied to this problem is that of the Polish internal reform.

Then, of course, the destinies of our common enemies, Japan and Germany, are to be considered. Again, we go back to the Yalta conference. It was decided then that the ultimate aim of our victory over these aggressors would be to rid them of militarism. Our nation is fighting these countries because they made war upon the people of the world; and because they forced upon their neighbors atrocties never before heard of in the history of the world.

The degree of future world leadership of this country and of other nations will be determined in part by the outcome of this

The determination of the war will not be affected. but upon this period of decision which our country is entering on a note of caution, perhaps, hinges the final outcome of many controveries, not only of our own time but also of posterity.

PLAY DAY! Its name signifies what it really is; it's a time of forgetting studies and cares to play—to play for play's sake and not for strenuous competition. #### No V-E Day Celebration

WITH the Russians in control of over half of Berlin and with American, British and French forces rapidly closing in on all sides, many Techsans have been discussing and wondering just what effect this will have on the length of the war, both in European and Pacific theaters.

Even though American people are being continually warned that the war is not yet over, it is difficult for most of us to realize that chances are Germany will not surrender when Berlin crumbles. In all probability it will take at least a month and perhaps even two or three times that long completely to conquer the Germans. Of course, with the fall of their capital, the worst fighting will be over. After that it will be a matter of time and of hunting them out of the hills where many have already fled for refuge.

If German civilians revolt, as many are predicting, then Allied forces should not have too much difficulty delivering the final blow. There has been some indication that not only the civilians but also many members of the German armed forces were almost jubilant when Allied armies marched in. With German morale so low, they may attempt to help defeat their already fallen dictator, or as the old saying goes, "there are only nine meals between the people and a revolution." With Berlin already encircled and supply routes cut off, it may be a matter of only three days or so.

As far as the Japanese are concerned, the fall of the Nazi

They realized some time ago that they would have to fight the war alone, and they have been making plans to continue without Germany's aid. There is ceratinly no assurance that Japan will run up her white flag as soon as the war ends in the European theater. It will take months and maybe even a year or more to defeat her.


