Fall registration in Texas Tech's
six schools was approximately 900
students short of the expected
gano enrollment figure when regu-
lar registration ended Saturday
afternoon.
As of Saturday, 8255 had en-
rolled for the fall semester with
the biggest influx being in the
School of Arts and Sciences where
2656 signed up this semester.
IN SECOND PLACE was the
School of Engineering with 2495
students.
The final tabulation is expected
to be boosted somewhat by late
registration which begins at 8
a.m. Wednesday in the East wing
of the Administration building.
