# War Changes Everything-

"TECH just is not what it used to be".

This one phrase is heard more on the campus at present than any other statement, in regard to our college.

It is very true that Tech has undergone severe changes in the past year. No more are the carefree days of special trains and busses; the Double T sign has gone to war; traditional functions of the past have either completely disappeared or have been modified to a great extent; left behind are the days of packed stadiums and gyms as fans conserve rubber and gas; and "Hop" Halsey's is even closing at ten o'clock now. Tech is going to the dogs, or so some say.

Tech is far from the dogs, but has simply fallen in line with the rest of the nation's colleges and universities and gone to war. For every one of the little and big things now missing on the campus, and in campus life, there are three or four times as many things missing in other countries.

War torn Europe has access to little of the convenience of this country. While we have no trains for football games, France has no trains for anything. The Double T sign has not been turned on this year, but the lights on the capitol dome have gone out, also. Our homecoming parade was very poor this year, and the varsity show's continuation is in doubt; yet many exstudents will never see another show or parade anywhere. No great number of fans pack the stands at football and basketball games due to transportation, yet the Poles, Swedes, and Norwegians have no chance at all to see any athletic contests. Hop is closing at 10 now due to the war, as are all other places along the avenue. While we complain of "lights out" along the Avenue, lights are never turned on in many countries in Europe and Asia.

No, Techsans we have no room for complaint. Very few of us actually realize there is a war being waged in the other hemisphere, except that we read about it in the paper and hear about it over the radio. When we are refused that second cup of coffee, we never think about those peoples "over there" who have none. We merely shake our heads and grumble about all these things we have to do without.

Tech must become war conscious. Several colleges in the United States have publicly pledged themselves to go all-out of Uncle Sam's team. Now is the time for us to forget our selfish motives, keep "rooting" for Tech; but work toward a Tech that is one hundred percent behind the greatest team in the world. Forget about little things such as sugar, cosmetics, hair pins, coffee, and other minor articles of selfish import. Concentrate on jeeps, aeroplanes, tanks, guns, and other materials vital to the fighting forces. Think about the biggest school of all, our country, and you will discover that Tech is just as much as it used to be, and perhaps even more.—Bill Barnett.

## Mercy Killings

DURING three months in the fall of 1940, it is estimated, 85,000 blind, incurably ill, or aged Germans were put to death by the Gestapo. "Mercy deaths" that they might be, civilization is again attacked and the age of barbarism is glorified in German occupied countries.

The recent appointment of First Group Leader Braun of the Elite Guard as dictator of the German Health service practically extends the power of the Nazi storm troopers over the health of the entire German populace. No doubt Hitler and his colleagues anticipate an extension of the only possible Germanic move that could be termed with "mercy."

Beginning with the mentally deficient, Nazi storm troopers and Gestapo agents have had the power to put to death anyone they desired. Systematic death notices in the German newspapers first caused the discovery of this purge of civilization; William Shirer noticed that mysterious death notices usually originated at one of three places. Relatives of the deceased would receive form notices:

"In view of his incurable disease, his death... is to be regarded as a release."

With this came the realization that Hitler had come on a plan to decrease his ineffective population the nation over, in order to provide food for the fighting man.

Evidently, the German people would not stand for such a movement, were they not bordering on starvation and aware that only the fittest would survive, all going to prove that the German food shortage is more immediate than was expected.

The Reich accused British bombers of bombing Bethel, hospital for mentally deficient children, but it is known that the head of the hospital refused to allow the Gestapo to do away with any of his patients and believed that the little man with the mustache chose this as a manner of doing away with his excess baggage without calling attention to the mercy killings. Bethel was near no military objective, and British bombers haven't the fuel nor bombs to waste on such a hospital as it obviously was of no vital importance to the war effort.

### Naval Auxiliaries Give Entrance Requirements

Would you like to know some thing more about the Coast Guard SPARS, newest of the three feminine military organizations? Ensign Marguerite Stuart, procurement officer for North and West Texas, and recent graduate of the Navy WAVES School at Smith College, today supplied these details:

Q. Where do you get the name SPARS?

A. It is derived from the Coast Guard Motto, Semper Paratus, which means "Always ready."

which means "Always ready."
Q. Is it divided into two groups
llike the Navy WAVES?
A. Yes, the SPARS are divided
into two groups—commissioned
officers and enlisted personnel.
Q. What are the qualifications
for an officer candidate?
A. The age 21 to 50, and it is
necessary that you be a graduate
of a recognized college or university.
Q. How about mathematics
courses?

A. The WAVES require two years of high school or college mathematics, but the SPARS do

not.
Q. May a married woman apply?
A. Yes, she may, provided she has no children under 18 and is not married to a man in the Coast Guard service. The wife of a Naval or Army officer is

Q. The SPARS is a sister or ganization of the WAVES, isn't it'.

A. Right. Officers will go to the same school—Smith College—for indoctrination. Enlisted personnel will be trained in schools already established by the WAVES. Not only that—the uniforms will be similar to the Women's Reserve of the U. S. Naval Reserve except that the Coast Guard device and insignia will replace the Navy crossed anchors. chors.

Q. If I want to become a par

of the enlisted personnel, how much education is required?

A. A high school diploma or graduation from a recognized business school, plus business ex-perience. The ages are 20 to 36, Q. May a SPAR be sent over-seas?

Seas?

A. No. The bill setting up the organization limits service to the continental limits of the United States. The purpose of enlisting women is to relieve Coast Guardsmen for duty affoat.

Q. How many women are needed?

Q. Who heads the organization:
A. Lieutenant Commander Dorothy C. Stratton, former dean of women at Purdue University.

CAPITAL & CAMPUS ACP's Jay Richter Reports from Washington

As colleges and universities lose their young men to the services at an ever-increasing rate, more and more attention is being directed at post-war educational opportunities for those who will be veterans of World War II.

After the last war, the government financed the education and vocational training of only those veterans who suffered injury during the war. This time the government's intentions appear to be much broader.

He said that the plan this time should "enable the young men whose education has been interrupted to resume their schooling and afford equal opportunity for the training and education of other young men of ability..."

That approach gives many enlightened educators reason to hope that the war's aftermath will bring a revitalized educational system, with selection of students based on ability rather than economic privilege.
