#### "Campus Scandal" Unveiled By Collier Editorialists

EIGHTY-TWO per cent of U. S. colleges do not require a course in U. S. History for graduation according to the "Campus Scandal" uncovered by the July 25th issue of Colliers in a recent survey by the New York Times. To quote further, Colliers says, "72 per cent of these institutions require no high school study of U. S. history for admission."

This national weekly magazine seems to think that the ission of U. S. history in college's required curriculas is a me that can be justified only by a complete reversal and quire every college student to study U. S. history. Claiming it a complete knowledge of history is necessary to an eduion, they have failed to consider the fact that students orarily study American history about three times before ening college and that a further course in the same subject is seficial only to those who specialize in that field.

S. tory in the fourth grade, again in the seventh, and again in junior or senior year in high school. 
