A Premature Second Front

"By the time you get this letter, news of a second front will be old," were the startling uncensored lines written in a letter from Master Sergeant Cullen Tibbets to Mrs. William Dingus, assistant professor of foreign languages. Serg. Tibbets, now stationed in the Western desert of Egypt is a 1939 graduate of Texas Tech, receiving his B. A. degree in foreign language. Because of his outstanding record in school and his knowledge of foreign languages, Tibbets is now with the intelligence division. He is also doing work in photography.

The fact that such a letter could have passed the censors shows the confidence of the allied nations to carry through plans for a second front opening in Africa. Being stationed at an advanced post, Tibbets said he could hear the guns of the 12th bombing group. This letter was written before the fall of Rommel who was then boasting this group had been wiped out.

Describing some of his experiences in the desert camp,

Describing some of his experiences in the desert camp, Tibbets told of spending the night in a reconnoisance car to try to get away from the terrible sandstorm raging there. Once when he received a 48 hour pass, Tibbet went to Cairo where, besides seeing all the famous landmarks, he took a bath and slept in a real bed. Some of the places he visited were the Sphinx, Nile river, Blue Mosque, Mohammed Aby or Alabaster, the Mosque and the many native bazarrs.

Indicating a turn in the tide even then, in the middle of October, were the actions of the Allies ,as reported by Tibets. He told of heavy bombing raids on Rommel's camps. Another encouraging remark made was that not once had the "Jerries" bombed that post.
