"Oh yes, the good old Bill of Rights, well that's fine," we thought. The story went on to say that the framed copy was hung in room 101 of the Library and intimated that it might be a good idea for Tech students to go and see what it was all about. We paused rather indignantly. Of course all good Tech students know that Bill of Rights is the name given to the first teamendments of the Constitution, and have known it since junior high days. It provides for freedom of speech, freedom of religion and freedom of the press—so there.

But strangely enough, when we were told to write an editorial on this subject so dear to our childhood, only the faintest, haziest snatches of it could we remember. So back we trekked to room 101 of the Library, and here, briefly is what it says.


