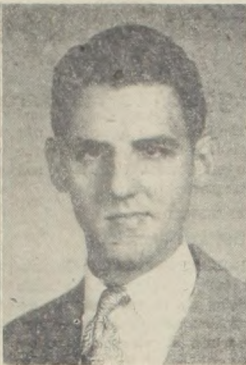

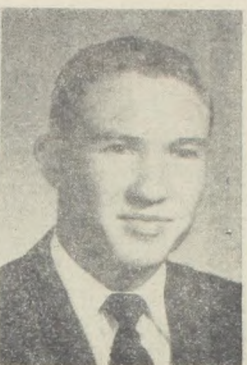

Ted Harrison and Ralph Shelton were elected editors of La Ventana and The Toreador at a meeting of the Publications committee Wednesday in J204.

Also elected at the meeting were Charlie Maple, Toreador business manager, and Earl Dietering, La Ventana business manager.

Harrison is an arts and sciences senior of Roswell, New Mexico, and Shelton is an arts and sciences junior of Dallas. Dietering is a Lubbock sophomore in the division of engineering and Maple is a junior from Claude in the division of arts and sciences.

Margaret Wood and Nina Spearman will compete for secretary and Max Preston and Donald Cotten will vie for business manager in major races in the election for Student Council and head cheerleader posts. Voting will begin at 8 a.m. tomorrow.

Secretary

Miss Wood states her platform as follows: "I believe that one of the major purposes of student government is to act as an evaluating agency, and in this function the Student Council should inspect all of the principle divisions of college life to determine their adequacy in serving student needs. In the event that student needs are not being satisfied, the Student Council should act as a recommending body to the administration of the college. As a part of this program, I wish to establish a committee for the purpose of evaluating the dormitory system. This committee should be composed of representatives from each of the dorms, chairmanned

by a member of the Council and under the direct auspices of the Council itself. Its function would be a monthly evaluation of counseling, food service, general policies and staff, with such evaluations being passed on by the Council and recommended to the dormitory supervision."

Miss Spearman made the following statement of platform: "If elected, I will serve the Student Council and the entire student body to the best of my ability by keeping an accurate account of all meetings and informing the student body of the proceedings which take place in the Student Council meetings."

Business Manager

Preston's platform is as follows: "I seek to be not merely a business manager, but rather YOUR business manager; and I will carry out the duties of that office industriously, efficiently and effectively."

Cotten made no statement for The Toreador.

Unopposed Races

J. C. Chambers and Bill Burton will have no opposition for the offices of president and vice president, respectively, of the Council.

Chambers released no statement of platform to The Toreador. Burton's platform was stated as follows:

"It is my belief that a student government program is completely effective only if it reaches the entire student body. For that reason, I am endorsing a program to reach and represent a larger number of students and draw them closer together through all-school activities which create more enthusiasm for Tech. Moreover, I favor continued emphasis on student evaluation of the faculty and on Tech's participation in the Texas Interscholastic Students Association."

Carnival Groups To Meet Thursday

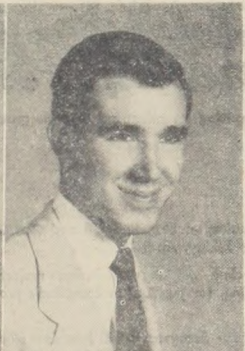
Representatives of organizations planning to participate in the Senior Carnival April 11 will meet at 5:15 p.m. Thursday in Ad162.

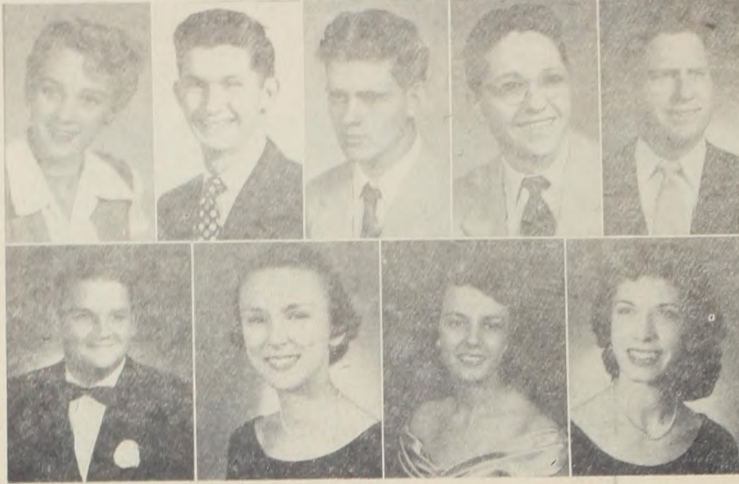


Three Business Administration Council Posts To Be Filled

BILL FRALEY: Student government by and for the students. Will work toward making the student association a governing body capable of achieving the true wishes and needs of the student body.

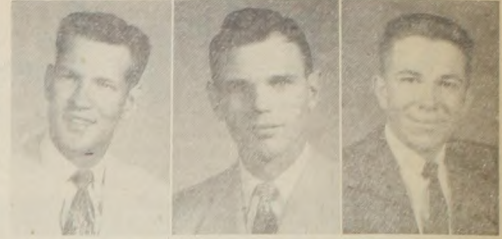

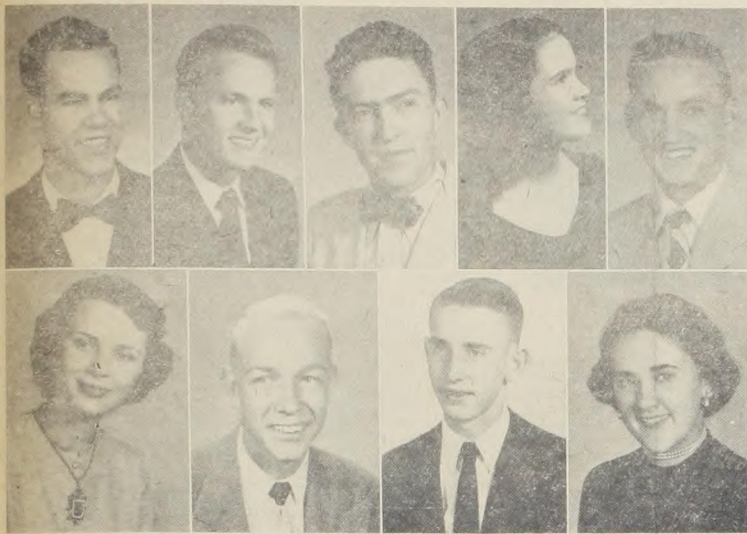

distribution of the SC part of the health and activity fee.

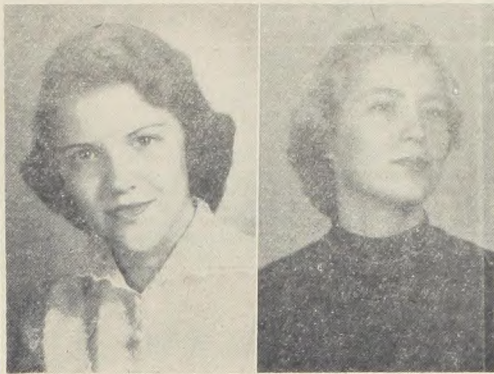
