was checked to make certain its level. After the equipment is in complete readiness it is expected the slab can be moved about 6 to 7 feet an hour.

ORIGINALLY scheduled for Wednesday morning, the lifting be-gan Friday afternoon and is ex-pected to continue next week, with the floor sections being raised after the roof is secured.

All slabs are expected to be in place in about 30 days, provided all goes well

EACH FLOOR of the building is divided into three sections and weighs approximately 425 tons.

Two consoles are located on the roof section at present and are used to control the lifting. Only a quarter-inch variance is allowed in the level of the giant slabs during the lifting process.

ORDINARILY about eight hours

will be used to raise a section.
The Lift Slab Corporation, using a patented process, is lifting the roof and the 425-ton floor sections by the hydraulic jacks set on top the columns.


