Inching slowly upward, the 380ton east roof sections of Texas Tech's new classroom and office Friday afternoon.
With "sidewalk superintendents" offering advice, the mammoth slab had moved to 13 inches by $3: 10$ 37 inches by $4: 30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.
SAND IN THE hydraulic jacks on top of the columns delayed the raising somewhat. Workers spent

All slabs are expected to be in place in about 30 days, provided all goes well.
