Ech has finally voted Wet! Yes, Melvin J. Wet, senior Agriculture student from Toot-Toot, Texas, was yesterday elected by the student body as Student Publications chairman for 1959-60, a post he has tried three times to capture, each time being apprehended.

Wet, when contacted by Toyletdor reporters said, "What, me worry?" He defeated his only opponent, Melvin Sturdley, by a bare margin of two votes to one vote in the hotly contested race.

Wet was recently married to the former Wanda Furd. When asked which candidate she voted for, Mrs. Wet's only reply was: "Tee-hee!"

ACROSS THE CAMPUS, the election results drew varied reactions. President N. E. Smith naturally said "We are viewing the matter with grave concern.

Student body president Don L. Echoes stated "It is a great Ech victory. We finally succeeded in getting a student to head the committee — and, what is even better, he knows absolutely nothing about publications.

Echoes and his council cohorts have been secretly campaigning for Wet, under the platform that someone outside of journalism should head the committee, because, of course, with someone connected with publications heading the show, they might too easily know what decisions to make concerning the publications.

"NATURALLY, WHEN YOU have a committee such as this, especially a political-type committee containing council members, you need to give the students a chance to haggle over issues, spend time filibustering about items — practicing like, you know, politicians.

"Why, with the old way, with journalism people heading the committee, it was no fun at all. And besides, that Toyletdor was getting pretty powerful. We needed to step in with the council and knock them down a notch."

Unknown to Echoes, Wet plans to cut all ties the publications committee has with the Toyletdor and La Vinder, and devote all of his time to his pet project — getting comic books into the shelves of the library.

WET MADE his intentions known in an interview with the Toyletdor minutes after his election was official. Sad Wet... "I hope I can carry out my campaign promises of 'a comic book in every pocket and an all-day sucker in every mouth.' My next objective will be to instate comic books as texts in Ech English courses.

Tech librarian R. C. (Royal Crown) Juneway threw his two bits worth in: "I would say, sir, that this abhorable and odious act on the part of the student body must in some manner be repealed at the earliest possible point in time." (Which, translated means — Man, I don't fade the jive of these cats and we gotta swing our way out of this jam.)

Alan Longhair Snout, noted English professor and prize-winning poet chimed in with, "I think that I shall never regret the students' action in voting Wet."








SHOWN ABOVE is the side-wise cameraman's conception of how the new Beatnik Student Union will look if and when completed on the Ech campus. (Ech Photo)

# Ech Leaders Have Chance to Produce

With the school year drawing to a close, student leaders should wind up activities with a bang, and make an otherwise drab and colorless year seem like a

First, foremost and front-running of the problems needing solving is the proposed tuition raise. If this anti-education move is passed into law, only playboys (and female counterparts), Vets and Lubbockites can afford to attend college.

Second, secondmost and second-running is the need to cut out the excessive profits, estimated by some at 30 per cent, made on used books by bookstores on or adjacent to the campus. If these profits aren't curtailed, the bookstores could be hit by adverse ICC fixed price rulings, because Ech has several out-of-state students.

One good point of the excessive profits is that, perhaps combined with a tuition hike, they can virtually eliminate skyrocketing college enrollment.

Third, thirdmost and third-running is the necessity of Ech's aligning with the South's third political party (non-Ech campus) to combat the dreadful possibility of integration on the Ech campus in the near future. It was bad enough when male and female students were integrated.

Besides, a move of this sort would pacify board members, and eliminate the embarassment of facing non-accreditation because of professors fired due to views on the integration question. We're not sure what bearing this last statement has on Ech's backing the third party, but it rings a bell.




DISGRUNTLED ELEMENTS in the faculty who have been forced to move back into the dorm by Dean Smith were suspected of being behind Smith's expulsion.
