# Tech fire officials asked to remove explosive ether

Tech Fire Marshal Arnold Miranda Monday was asked to remove 30 gallons of used petroleum ether from the Meats Laboratory to avert a possible explosion. One expert said five gallons of petroleum ether could level the main wing of the Student Union Building in an explosion.

Tuesday Miranda would not say whether the petroleum ether had been disposed of. He said Tech Building and Maintenance Director O. R. Downing could comment on the status of the liquid. Downing could not be reached for

According to Dr. Dale Zinn, chairman of the animal science department, the solvent chemical had been accumulated over the past six to eight months.

Dr. Boyd Ramsey, animal science professor, and Lucy Porter, head animal science lab technician, said the petroleum ether should have been disposed of as it was used, but that it was

The chemical is used in small quantities by the Meats Lab to extract fat from meat. After use, the waste liquids are normally poured down a sink.

Porter said the 30 gallon waste quantity had been accumulated and stored in its original containers for unknown reasons.

because the Meats Lab staff was not experienced in disposing of such a large amount of the volatile liquid.

Miranda, in a statement Monday, said about 30 gallons of the "highly flammable" liquid were located in a Meats Lab store room, and that he would consult with the Lubbock fire marshal on how to dispose of it.

Lubbock Fire Marshal A. C. Black said he advised Miranda to burn the liquid in an open field, since such burning would not be subject to explosion.

He said transporting the liquid was the most critical part of the operation, and he advised Miranda to "handle it like nitro glycerine" while moving it.

Miranda said in his original statement that heat or any kind of jostling could cause an explosion.

Fire Marshal Black said five gallons of the liquid would "just about level" the main (north) wing of the Student Union Buklding. He added that age will increase the liquid's volatility.

Porter said used petroleum ether will no longer be allowed to accumulate in large quantities in the Meats Lab, or be stored in its original containers.

Dr. Zinn stated there has never been a fire or explosion in the Animal Science Department caused by petroleum ether.

#### Thieu stands firm on all-Indochina truce

SAIGON (AP) - President Nguyen Van Thieu said Tuesday night that Hanoi has requested a cease-fire and one could come soon, but he stood firm on his demand that any truce must cover all Indochina and be internationally guaranteed.

Thieu also rejected a tripartite coalition government for South Vietnam, as proposed by the Communists. He said his country's political future could be negotiated only between Saigon and the Communist-led National Liberation Front, known as the Viet Cong, based on free elections.

"There may be a cease-fire in the near future because the Communists have requested it," he told his countrymen in a broadcast. "They agree to it, and even beg for it, because they are weak militarily."

He said the Communists had implored the United States for a cease-fire agreement in order to keep territory they have recently captured.

Thieu asserted the North Vietnamese want the cease-fire ahead of the Nov. 7 presidential election because President Nixon might be tougher to deal with if re-

His two-hour national radio and television speech shed some light on his five days of intensive talks with Henry A.

It coincided with the disclosure that the United States had cut back on its bombing of North Vietnam in what sources called "a sign of good will." Thieu, who has steadfastly opposed a bombing reduction, did not comment on this.

He said his talks with Kissinger had been exploratory and that no formal agreements had been reached. At another point he called them "very clear and useful discussions."

In Washington, White House press secretary Ronald L. Ziegler claimed "some progress has been made at achieving a negotiated settlement of the Vietnam conflict." He spoke after Kissinger had briefed Nixon on the meetings with Thieu.

Thieu's speech, typically not announced in advance, was essentially a reiteration of his long-standing positions on a cease-fire and political solution, and contained these major points:

—The Communist peace proposals are 'dark schemes aimed at taking over

-The 1954 Geneva accords, which probided for international supervision of the truce, should be used by both sides as the basis for an agreement.

-Any cease-fire acceptable to Saigon must encompass all Indochina, including Cambodia and Laos, and must be guaranteed internationally. The North Vietnamese must pull all troops and equipment back to North Vietnam.

—A tripartite government consisting of Saigon, the Viet Cong and a third neutral element is unacceptable.

He said a political solution, based on free elections, can be worked out only by the South Vietnamese government and the Viet Cong.

-South Vietnam will not be forced into any agreement which it does not want.

# Grover stresses reform in Lubbock campaign

State Sen. Hank Grover of Houston, Republican gubernatorial candidate, campaigned in Lubbock Tuesday at the Republican County Headquarters during an open press conference. Grover stressed the issue of reform as an important reason for converting Texas' long-time Democratic Party control of state government into a two-party system by electing the first Republican governor of this century.

Grover, opposing Democrat Dolph Briscoe in the November general election, claimed to "run a people's campaign. I am running on my own merit and am presenting my own case across the

He expanded briefly on several of his campaign issues including endorsement of the North American Water Resource Plan and long range water provision for all of Texas from Canadian resources. He pledged his support to an engineering plan which would provide a series of canals in Texas linking major river beds.

Grover spoke briefly of fighting against what he termed "welfare fraud" by initiating new programs to aid the truly needy. He also expressed concern with crime and violence. Favoring reinstatement of the death penalty in Texas, Grover said, "If I'm elected governor, I will give full prestige to all law enforcement officers." He also favored denial of bail to many repeat offenders.

in the public schools for 13 years, he advocated educational reform by "getting more for our educational dollar, not by spending more." He also came out in favor of no-fault insurance. "It is better than what we have today, and it has been proven that it will reduce insurance rates and law suits," he said. Grover served six years in the House

as a Democrat. In 1966 he switched parties because, he said, he felt the Texas Democratic Party was being pulled into line with the philosophy of the national Democratic Party. He has since served six years in the Senate as a Republican.

"Party labels are not really important, because I believe the people of Texas vote for the man and his individual and political philosophies, not the party. If elected I would not function as Democrat or Republican but as Governor of

Concerning his chances for election, Grover seemed optimistic, commenting that two years ago Paul Eggers, Republican for Governor, obtained 47 per cent of the vote and "that was before Sharpstown or McGovern." He also quoted a recent survey taken in Abilene which attributed 53 per cent of the vote there to himself.

Grover acknowledged the need for revision of the Texas Constitution and suggested submitting a three-part document, each covering a branch of government, to the people to vote upon for revision.

The senator had praise for the press in Texas saying, "I have received tremendous coverage from the media, and it is because of this that I feel a Republican can win."

#### Supreme court justice says senate case moot

A suit filed against Arts and Sciences (A&S) Senator Candy Hall and newlyappointed Graduate Senator Dennis Graham has been placed in judicial limbo by the Tech Supreme Court.

Kenneth Senn, supreme court chief justice, has cancelled tonight's scheduled hearing of the case before the court. "There's really no question any longer," Senn said. "The Senate Rules Committee has stated that she (Hall) does have a 2.0 grade-point average (GPA), so I feel that the issue now is moot."

The suit, filed early Monday by A&S Senator Denise Westbrook alleged that Hall was not qualified to serve in the senate because of lack of the required 2.0 GPA. The rules committee, in a latenight meeting, ruled that Hall did have the necessary grades to serve as a

said. "The method we arrived at this conclusion was that Monday afternoon, senators Hall, myself, Ben Florey and Kay Ford talked to Dr. Ivan Little (associate dean of Arts and Sciences).

"He advised us that, with Senator Hall's permission, we acquire a copy of her transcript. He then informed us of the method the College of Arts and Sciences uses to compute grade-point average for graduation. We got a copy of her transcript and computed her grade point and she did have over a two-point," he said.

Westbrook's suit also claimed that Graham's recent appointment as graduate senator was illegal because "one senator (Hall) did not have the specified grade-point necessary to hold a seat in the senate." Graham was approved by exactly two-thirds vote by the senate last week. Because Hall voted to approve Graham's nomination, her disqualification as a senator could have left his appointment in question. However, the rules committee's unanimous decision that Hall was "a senator in good standing" and the subsequent refusal of the supreme court to hear the case tonight nullifies Westbrook's contentions.

Asked if a court case is still possible against Hall and Graham, Senn said, "It's possible that if Senator Westbrook wishes to pursue the matter, she could refile her case.

"Her contention would have to be that the rules committee erred in their certification that Candy Hall has a 2.0 GPA. However, I don't know how fruitful that would be.

Senator Westbrook said she did not anticipate taking any further action.

# Reporter released from jail, though didn't reveal sources

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) - Newsman Peter Bridge was released from jail Tuesday after serving 21 days for refusing to answer a grand jury's questions about a story he wrote.

Bridge, the first newsman jailed since the U.S. Supreme Court ruled journalists may not withhold information from

grand juries, was unconditionally released at 4 p.m. EDT by New Jersey Superior Court Judge James R. Guiliano.

Under the terms of his sentence, Bridge was to be released at the expiration of the term of the Essex County grand jury that had questioned him. Guiliano said he would dismiss the grand

jury Wednesday, but said, "Mr. Bridge is released now, so he won't have to stay in jail overnight."

At the same time, Guiliano released a presentment handed up by the grand jury 10 days ago - its findings in an investigation of a dispute involving the Newark Housing Authority.

Bridge said, "It feels very good to be out, but I'd do it again if I had to.

"They didn't yield and I didn't yield," he said. "They won in court, I won in the end; we won in the end." "They don't seem to believe in freedom

of the press," he said of the Essex County prosecutor's office. Bridge entered the Essex County jail

on Oct. 4, after the U.S. Supreme Court refused to overturn his contempt citation. Bridge had written a story last May in the now defunct Evening News of Newark, quoting Housing Authority Commissioner Pearl Beatty as saying she was offered a bribe to influence her vote for the authority's new executive director.

Bridge claimed many of the questions posed by the grand jury in its investigation of the alleged bribe went beyond the scope of his article and would compromise his freedom of speech.

#### New finance records filed for candidates

WASHINGTON (AP) — Committees set up to finance President Nixon's reelection campaign have spent at least \$22 million since April, almost double the amount spent for Democratic presidential candidate George McGovern.

New reports filed with the General Accounting Office showed Tuesday that while the chief Nixon finance committee was slightly in debt earlier this month, its numerous satellites had a minimum of \$4.7 million going into the final two weeks of the campaign.

McGovern's key campaign committee, McGovern for President, Inc., of Washington, D.C., showed a cash deficit of \$107,000 and debts of \$2.86 million. But
