Changes in dorm areas recommended in report

The recommendation stated in the report that upper class women, those with 32 hours or above, with parental permission, should be allowed selective hours.

For instance, Tech's presentation included letters from Murray and Lubbock's Chamber of Commerce, and slides showing the campus as well as 52 delegates from Tech supporting the bid. The decision is made by the Executive Committee which consists of all the regional presidents, the conference chairman, national president and national vice-president.

The delegates that attend the conference are selected in different ways, but are usually chosen or elected from members of the residence councils. The delegates will be staving at Robby's while the advisors will stay at the Rodeway Inn. A \$45 registration fee is required of each delegate.

Editorial **Top candidates**

Today's elections will be critical to the performance of next year's Senate.

If you're tired of feeling like the Senate doesn't do anything, try voting for someone who is willing to work for you.

In the Arts and Sciences race the list of good candidates is headed by incumbents Cameo Jones and Dennis Graham. Both have done excellent jobs since they were elected last year. Two of the other three posts should be filled by Doug Williams and David (Dave) Ammons. Williams is currently president of Men's Residence Council and working hard. Ammons is something of a darkhorse in the race, but is the most conscientious candidate running for any seat.

In Engineering, the outstanding candidate is Peppy Bratton. (He and Ammons are Saddle Tramps.) They will make solid senators.

Of the four seats in Business Administration, the names to remember are John and Robin. Incumbent John (O.J.) Simpson is as qualified for office as any man on on campus could be. Candidates Robin Cash and Robin Anderson are equally concerned about campus affairs, and should be put to work where they can do the most good.

From the schools of Agriculture, Home Economics and Education, only one candidate really stands out -Belinda Leftwich of Education.

As for graduate school, the incumbent Garry Kelly has done little. Gary Lambert would be a solid choice for one of the two seats, however.
