TECH THE MELTING POT

That Tech has the largest proportional enrollment of freshmen of any school in the South is an undeniable fact. By the same token the "transfer" enrollment is the highest based on a matter of percentage. These two facts in relation to the student body of the college are comparable to the population of the United States. It might be well said the Tech is a most American institution. The freshmen represent the native born element and the transfers are symbolical to the foreign representation. The very fact that so many different schools are represented in the student enrollment gives the school an opportunity to be a very cosmopolitan college. By judiciously selecting the better qualities of his late school and incorporating them into the being of the Tech each transfer can confer a lasting good on the quality of the school. On the other hand a few radicals can play havoc with the establishment of desirable precedents and it will take a new college years to overcome the harmful influences thus brought to bear on it in its infancy. As a suggestion as to necessary additions and improvements the mentioning of Student Associations do not form them. It takes work and most of the work must be done by students with experience. Placing the self government of a college into the hands of entirely new and untried officials would be disastrous, but these same people with the guiding hand of some experienced person to aid them could easily establish a student association that would be the model of the nation's colleges. For these and many other reasons each transfer must be careful and not make any unthoughted or rash steps to the detriment of the school that bids well to become the largest in the state.

IIt is understood that Tech faculty members who do not hold degrees carrying with them the title of "Doctor" are often embarrassed because students have formed the habit of using the title in addressing them. One sure way of climinating the annoyance would be to drop the titles entirely when addressing faculty members. It is not at all improper to do such a thing. 
