The passing of Dr. S. P. Brooks, who for more than 6 years had been president of Baylor university, is a loss to the state and nation, as well as to his family and Baylor. Accounts of his gallant fight against death by remaining cheerful were received daily, until he quietly passed into the fatal coma. Dr. Brooks knew that he had passed into the fatal coma. The university presidents last labor for Baylor was to sign diplomas to be presented to this year's graduating class. He had signed more than half of them when he became so weak that the doctor forbade him to continue. The half of the class that receive diplomas with his signature will treasure them. The other half will re-ceive theirs under another signature, but the knowledge that Dr. Brooks died trying will make amends.

The entire class will be proud that they are an lumnus of a university that has had the distinct honor have of being guided through 28 years of useful service by a man that will be remembered for all time as one of the state's greatest men.






