A publication fund for helping maintain the Toreador would not only make this a better newspaper, but would make a semi-weekly paper and would tend to make it rank on an even basis with the best college papers in the Southwest.

There should be a tax of 75c per semester on every student enrolled in school. A tax of this type could be placed on every student and no great financial burden would be placed on any particular student. This tax would enable every student to read the Toreador twice weekly at the breakfast table, for a fund could be established and carriers could be afforded.

The present fund is composed entirely of the revenue from advertising and is not capable of either affording carriers or a semi-weekly paper. Lubbock is not large enough to have enough advertisers to support a semi-weekly paper from resources of this type and the only way a semi-weekly paper can be afforded is for a fund to be established for the purpose of maintaining a paper of this type.

After all, a college newspaper is to a college what a community paper is a fair college paper but why have a fair one when The Toreador could be and should be the leader of all Southern college papers. A small fund made compulsory for every student would make this a paper of this type.


In theory, the honors system gives the student of unusual ability an opportunity to do work suited to his capacities. In practice, it does not only that, but it gives a basis for classing students, at the end of their sophomore year, according to their intelligence. In several universities, freshmen and sophomores can take only certain required courses. This practice guides confused and blundering new students toward a definite goal and prevents them from plunging into work which is too advanced.

At the end of the second year in college, all sophomore students are required to take comprehensive examinations. The result classes the students and shows which ones can do advanced work in special fields. Those who rank highest are honors candidates. If their work in the junior and senior year justifies this ranking, the upper 20 per cent are graduated with distinction.

The required work of the first two years guarantees that the student has mastered the elementary courses and has a good background for specialization. The examinations give definite information as to the students' ability.

Texas Tech, being a new school, should adopt new and true ideas, instead of clinging to the old method of treating the genius and the dullard alike. With no entangling customs and traditions to hinder, Tech could build and maintain the reputation of progressiveness.
