GIVE IT DUE CONSIDERATION

The proposed constitution, which will be submitted students soon, should be carefully studied by every Tech citizen before he casts a vote.

The Toreador doubts if the new document is a vast improvement over the old one. Creation of a cabinet in the executive department and of the two student courts may seem good, but the power of the courts is uncertain, depending almost entirely upon recommendations of the deans. We agree that the proposed system of preferential voting is all right and that it especially looks good on paper. But we doubt if it will work.

As stated, The Toreador doubts if the new document

As stated, The Toreador doubts if the new document is superior to the old one, and there are two things we can not support, namely, the provision for the publication board and the clause providing that if a person is accused he can not find out who did the accusing.

The provision for the publication board is the biggest joke we ever heard of. Tht document provides that the board shall be composed of two faculty members, two students appointed by the council, the editor of La Ventana and editor of The Toreador. It further says that a majority vote shall prevail, UNLESS the two faculty members voted for a motion and the two faculty members opposed it, the motion would be lost. The four students in this case would be mere figureheads, and certainly it would not be worth their time to serve on the board. The Toreador suggests that if a majority vote is to prevail that it prevail, no matter who cast the minority votes, faculty members or no faculty members.

In reading that part of the constitution which says the accuser shall not have his name known if he accuses someone. one would find his mind going back to the dark ages of history where men were held guilty until proved innocent and where men were tried for crimes when they were never indicted. If a student is ashamed to face the one he accuses or afraid for people to know he did the accusing, surely fibe crime would not be worth bringing to trial.

We repeat that the document should be studied very

We repeat that the document should be studied very carefully by every student. Then if a majority of the students deem it better than the old one that it be adopted. But The Toreador does suggest that the two provisions previously discussed be changed.

KO-SHARI-A UNIQUE NAME

Hundreds of years ago there roamed in the great Southwest a group of Pueblo Indians. Certain members of this group, who might in this day and time be known as "whoopee" or delight makers, were known as the "Ko-Sharis," their main purpose being to direct ceremony and fun for the red men.

And now a group of Tech co-eds, formerly known as Les Cigales, have chosen Ko-Shari for the name of their club. In adopting this name they also have adopted age old traditions and initiatory ceremonies, based on the rituals used by the tribe at least one thousand years before the white man came to America.

The Toreador thinks these co-eds have picked good name, one that carries with it things of historical interest.

WHY NOT ONE ELECTION DAY?

The Toreador would like to see one big election day adopted for Texas Tech.

We suggest that the first Tuesday in May of each year be set aside for the election of editors and business managers of the two publications, president, vice president and accretary of the student council and yell leaders. We further suggest that all voting be by secret ballot, and that on the night preceeding the election a big campaign really be held.

We believe his would create more interest in Tech politics, which in turn by attracting more candidates and more students to vote would assure the college of better officeholders.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STUDENT ASSOCIATION OF TEXAS

Preamble: We, the students of Texas Technological college, in order to bring about a democratic spirit on our campus, and to foster the principle of mass participation in our student government, do hereby establish this Constitution of the Student association of Texas Technological college.

ARTICLE I-THE LEGISLATURE

Section 7. The signer of an indictanent shall not be required to appear against the accused, nor shall his name become known outside the court.
