New Building Needed

Nine years ago, a record enrollment of over thirteen hundred students thronged to Lubbock from all parts of West Texas and some from Central and East Texas to initiate the opening of the state's baby institution. In this, the beginn full time courses, representing approximately a 24 per cent increase over the first semester enrollment of 1933.

The upprising first year enrollment caused the hurried rection during the next year of the gymnasium, he home conomics building, and the agricultural uildings as temporary structures to be replaced y substantial, adequate buildings when the in-rease demanded it. Today, with a 90 per cent screase in enrollment these same buildings are ying to serve an enrollment of 2500 students. There is another institution in this state, which turing the past year has erected a new building t an expenditure that exceeds the cost of all of each's buildings combined. Considering all the ther buildings the institution already possesses, the roportion is too distorted in comparison to the arollment of Texas Tech. There are other institutions of this state which ave one-half Tech's enrollment, but have build-ings valued at twice as much, with twice as many uildings and some of them empty. Some institu-ons are tearing down substantial buildings are ery inadequate; a larger library would be inval-able; the gymnasium is a shame to the student ody when it is called in general convocation. Tech's enrollment deserves recognition. The poporters of the institution are hopeful that when prejudiced, unbiased facts about these necessi-re are placed before our legislators, that Tech's rowded situation will soon be remedied.
