### The Proposed Stadium

ACCORDING to a report from President Bradford Knapp's office, preliminary filing has been made with a PWA engineer of Fort Worth for a stadium at Tech to be completed by the fall of 1935, at a cost of approximately \$150,000. Tentative plans for the project call for a stadium which will have a seating capacity of 15,000, will have modern dressing and physical education rooms, showers, and lockers.

A new stadium would be invaluable to the athletic department and to the student body and to the prestige of the college, A stadium would bring about an impetus in football enthusiasm not only for Lubbock but all over the South Plains. The present seating capacity is very inadequate, and if Tech ever wishes to have overflowing crowds, steps must be taken to accommodate them.

Public Works Administration grants are not given free gratis, without any obligation for repayment, regardless of the worthiness of the project. Instead a per cent of the original loan must be repaid in yearly installments, lasting from ten to fifty years, according to the immensity and type of the loan granted. A PWA project must be one that is partially self-paying. Each student in Texas Tech can help to finance this worthy project by buying a season athletic ticket. That is all that is asked of the students. If Tech does not build a new stadium in the near future, there is always the possibility of the City of Lubbock building one of its own, thus drawing grid attractions of sectional interest away from Tech campus.

The administration of the college can obtain the necessary funds for building a stadium, but the student body must back it one hundred per cent before such a program can be attempted. The Toreador urges that every student of Tech back this program, and help give Tech a stadium of which every one would be justly proud. It would be a progressive step forward for Texas Tech.


