

# Recession closer?

Congress should concentrate on decreasing unemployment instead of inflation, deficit

American Dream:

- Young people "fresh out of high school" are having a hard time finding "good wages and steady work," a New York Times survey discovered. Household incomes where the principal earner is under 25 fell by 19 percent in the decade

- The Times reported recently that numerous working people in New York City, like many in Moscow, are having to share apartments or houses, being unable to find or afford their own.

Similarly grim examples are common everywhere, and you don't need three guesses to find the common denominator among them: a stumbling U.S. economy that even George Bush admits is "sluggish."

That's a mild word for an engine performing at far less than capacity, in which unemployment nearing 6 percent has come to be regarded as normal. Not too many years ago, 4 percent unemployment was the national goal; 3 percent was sometimes achieved, and many wage employees earned high incomes. Now the overall economy not only is producing too few jobs; the new service-dominated economy is providing too few good jobs at substantial wages.

One consequence is that too little revenue is being raised to finance governments confronted with strong, in some cases rising,

demands for public services. A second consequence is that insufficient savings for the future are being accumulated - and the cost of a good education system should be counted as a savings for the future.

Attempting to remedy this situation by reducing the federal budget deficit puts the cart before the Here are three reports from the horse, despite claims from both parties and from president and Congress. What is needed, instead, is a bold program to expand aggregate demand - to increase the purchasing power of the American people. That means jobs, putting people back to work.

To hear recent presidents and Congresses tell it, the only economic enemies to be feared are inflation and budget deficits. Little is said about unemployment and underemployment and the millions payers, predictably, are up in of Americans too discouraged to seek a job. Yet these are the chief causes of shrinking demand and the consequent "sluggish" economy.

A program to expand employment and increase demand would get the horse out front where it belongs, pulling the cart along; because in the long run it would also reduce the federal deficit, probably more than the recent "deal" or any other in prospect. That result would not be immediate, but neither will negotiated deficit reduction; anyway, the American insistence on quick fixes and overnight results is one of the nation's most prevalent weaknesses.

As employment and demand increase, a stimulated economy will begin to produce greater revenues - not only for the federal government but for starved states and cities. That will make possible expanded public investment in improved education — perhaps the single greatest need for the American future — and in such other necessities as redeemed and expanded infrastructure (highways, bridges, sewage and water systems, etc.).



Investment in such necessities they are more than merely desirable - will also be useful beyond its effect on revenues. Expanded job opportunities for young people, for example, may have some good effect on crime rates. Better health care, particularly for children (in a country where an

eighth of the population has no medical insurance and millions get no or inadequate treatment) will mean a healthier work force, just as better education means a more capable work force; and both will contribute to greater productivity and renewed American competitiveness.

Apologists for the recent budget deal claim that it should cause increased private investment because of a reduction in interest rates expected to follow reduced federal borrowing. But there's been little evidence since the budget deal that the Federal Reserve can or will reduce rates sufficiently to produce

the promised effect; and there's no proof, anyway, that lower rates, if realized, will cause business to invest in a sluggish economy.

What will cause increased private investment, as numerous economic studies show, is strong and growing demand.

There stands the president of the United States, an exuberant smile on his face, the American flag behind him. At his left stands another smiling president, Hafez Assad of Syria - dictator, assassin of thousands of his own people, master of terrorists who specialize in bombing airplanes.

Assad smiles because the United States has made him the first winner in the Persian Gulf confrontation.

The story told by the photograph reads clearly. Once again, and for the second time in barely four months, the United States is pandering to a Middle East dictator.

It is a policy that allowed Saddam Hussein to think he could get away with invading Kuwait. It is the policy that once again will bring crisis and danger to the United States and the Middle East.



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# Post office to hold dorm mail during break

By MELISSA SHARP The University Daily

Students who live in a Texas Tech residence hall other than Gaston Hall or Gaston Apartments will not receive mail sent to their Tech addresses during winter break.

Peggy Vanlandingham, an accounting clerk for the Tech copy and mail centers, said the post office will not deliver mail to the closed residence halls after Dec. 11. Mail delivery will resume Jan. 7.

"We don't want them to have anyone send them anything important during that time," Vanlandingham said.

Gaston Hall and Gaston Apartments will stay open during the break, and the post office will deliver mail as usual.

Accountable mail, including insured, registered and certified mail, will be delivered to PostTech in West Hall. Students may pick up accountable mail before Dec. 24 and after Jan. 1.

"If their parents are mailing them tickets, and the tickets get here on the 13th instead of the 12th, they are in trouble," Vanlandingham said. "They better send them certified."

Residence hall mail will be at the downtown post office until the halls open Jan. 7.

"Per the instructions of the housing department at Tech, Gaston mail will be delivered, but the remainder will be held here until we resume delivery after the holidays," said John Levacy, manager of the general mail facility in Lubbock.

Levacy said students cannot pick up their mail at the post office. The mail will not be sorted until it arrives at Tech.

"This would be a good time for them to ask people to send mail to another address," Levacy said.

Vanlandingham said the post office will deliver departmental mail until Dec. 2. Delivery will resume Jan. 2. Department representatives may pick up mail between 7:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. Dec. 27, 28 and 31 at PostTech.

The post office will deliver mail to the private post office boxes in West Hall during winter break, Vanlandingham said. Students can check their boxes during business hours except on Sundays, Christmas and New Year's Day.

# Tech to face No.17 Fighting Tigers in South Region semifinal Raiders move into spot for possible rematch with Southwest Conference-foe Lady Longhorns

As the Texas Tech women's volleyball team players waited outside the women's gym Tuesday for practice to start, the last thing on

their minds was Louisiana State. But while they talked of upcoming final exams, coach Mike Jones reminded them of the task at hand.

The Red Raiders will take on the 17th-ranked Fighting Tigers at 6 p.m. Friday in Texas' Rec Sports Center in Austin in the semifinal round of the South Region.

Friday's other semifinal matchup will pit No. 7 Texas against Kentucky.

The winners of Friday's matches will meet in the South Region final to be played at 7 p.m. Saturday. Tech trails in its series with LSU,

4-5, the most recent match coming in the 1989 Red Raider Classic. The Fighting Tigers defeated the

Raiders 10-15, 14-16, 11-15, and has won each of the last three meetings between the two teams. Tech last defeated Louisiana State in 1981.

Jones said he was not surprised at how tough Texas-Arlington played in the Raider's 16-14, 15-4, 16-14 first-round victory over the Lady Mavericks.

"I was expecting them to play well," Jones said. "We knew they were getting better and knew they were going to play tough."

Junior middle blocker Chris Martin was Tech's Whataburger Player of the Week for her seven-kill, fiveblock and 12-dig performance against Texas-Arlington.

Junior outside hitter Sabrina Zenon paced the Raider victory with 15 kills and 12 digs.

Zenon said the team is trying not to be bothered by the pressure of advancing to the semifinal round of the NCAA tournament.

"We try to think of them as just regular games instead of the NCAA tournament," Zenon said. "There is a little bit more pressure but we try not to look at it that way."

Louisiana State, the South Region's No. 3 seed, enters Friday's game by virtue of a convincing 15-9, 15-1, 15-7 win over Louisville.

The Fighting Tigers have come on strong of late, winning 11 matches in a row and 24 of their last 25.

LSU junior outside hitter Monique Adams led the way offensively against the Cardinals with 15 kills,

while 6-1 middle blocker Nyla Shepherd finished with 11 kills, 13 digs and 3 blocks.

Zenon said LSU is a tough hitting and blocking team, but it lacks a strong passing game.

"They're real tall and they hit really hard," Zenon said. "But they don't have that much ball control. So I think if we control the ball on our side of the net, we can beat them."

Jones said the key to beating the Fighting Tigers is an overall effort from the team.

"If we can dig a lot of balls and keep the ball in play, then the longer the rallies will go and more of a chance that we'll have of winning a few," Jones said. "If we can do that, then I think we'll have a good chance at them."

A Tech victory Friday could lead to a third meeting with the Lady Longhorns. The Raiders' only two losses this season have been at the hands of Texas, and Tech has not beaten them since 1977.

Zenon said the Raiders cannot help but think about a rematch with the Lady Longhorns.

"If we get a chance to play them again, I think we'll be ready to play," Zenon said. "A lot of people are saying 'maybe they'll get upset', but I'd rather play them than have someone upset them."

A school-record four Raiders were named to the all-Southwest Conference teams for the 1990 season last Friday.

Senior middle blocker and all-America candidate Lisa Clark became Tech's first all-SWC firstteam selection since 1987, while senior setter Sheila Solomon, Martin and Zenon were name to the all-SWC second team.

The Raiders finished the regular season ranked sixth in the nation in dig average at 20.9 digs per game, while Solomon ranked 18th individually in digs with 4.14 per

Solomon is also Tech's career

assist leader with 3,281 and the school record-holder for digs in a career with 1,129.


Jones was also named the SWC's Coach of the Year in only his second year as a collegiate head coach.

#### East German athletes admit steroid use

FRANKFURT, Germany (AP) — Experts in the former East Germany developed a doping nasal spray before the 1988 Olympics that was virtually undetectable, a leading swimmer alleged Tuesday.

Raik Hannemann, who on Monday admitted taking performanceenhancing drugs, said the spray had the same effect as anabolic steroids and traces of its use would disappear after three days.

Hannemann and other athletes on Tuesday accused former East German sports chiefs of developing a perfect, systematic doping program and of offering hard currency as an incentive for taking drugs.

The growing doping scandal is shaking sports in united Germany and threatening to cut off support from wealthy corporate sponsors.



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
