**STARTING THIS WEEK: "JUNGLE BOOK"** (Disney, \$24.99): The latest animated classic to be released from the Disney vaults to home video, this charming adaptation of the Rudyard Kipling saga follows the adventures of Mowgli, an adventurous youngster raised by wolves ... and befriended by numerous other dwellers of the animal kingdom. Phil Harris, Louis Prima and Sterling Holloway are among those providing voices. \*\*\* (G)

**"AVALON"** (RCA/Columbia, \$91.95): Director Barry ("Rain Man") Levinson's affectionate and truly moving recollection of his own heritage dramatizes his ancestors' move to Baltimore, where the true meaning of family becomes clear as they enjoy triumphs and endure hardships. The superb cast includes Armin ("Music Box") Mueller-Stahl, Joan Plowright, Aidan Quinn and Elizabeth Perkins. \*\*\* (PG: P)

**"GRAVEYARD SHIFT"** (Paramount, \$91.95): The latest Stephen King story to reach the theatrical screen, though TV also has been having a field day with his tales (such as "IT"), this gory chiller — filmed in King's home territory of Maine — puts the nighttime workers at a newly reopened textile mill at the mercy of killer rats. David ("The Antagonists") Andrews and Brad Dourif star. \*\* (R: P, GV)

**HELD OVER: "THE BONFIRE OF THE VANITIES"** (Warner, \$92.95): Most critics made a figurative bonfire out of director Brian De Palma's version of Tom Wolfe's best-seller, but it still has ample star power. Tom Hanks plays a yuppie who becomes a pariah after his mistress (Melanie Griffith) hits a black youth with his car; Bruce Willis is the reporter who sees the story as his meal ticket. \*\*\* (R: AS, P, V)

**"DEAD RECKONING"** (MCA/Universal, \$79.95): Originally made for cable's USA network, this melodrama on the high seas exposes a romantic triangle with the potential to become lethal. Cliff Robertson and Susan Blakely play a couple taking a private voyage, but their captain (actor-singer Rick Springfield) turns out to be her ex-lover. Imagine the fun when they all become stranded. \*\* (R: AS, P, V)

**"FROM HERE TO ETERNITY"** (Vidmark, Apr. 10, \$89.95): Not to be confused with the Oscar-winning 1953 version, this retelling of the James Jones novel is abridged from the later TV miniseries (1979), with William Devane as the World War II sergeant who's involved with another officer's wife (Natalie Wood). Kim Basinger, Steve Railsback and Peter Boyle also are in the cast. \*\*\* (PG-13: AS, P, V)

**COMING SOON: "MR. DESTINY"** (Touchstone, May 8): An unhappy man (James Belushi) gets to see how his life might have been different; Michael Caine is his guide. (PG-13)

**"QUIGLEY DOWN UNDER"** (MGM/UA, May 8): Tom Selleck mounts up as a cowboy in Australia, in a western directed by Simon ("Lonesome Dove") Wincer. (PG-13)

The reasons for the difference aren't hard to uncover.

London, Barcelona and Frankfurt are, for the

first time, experiencing what it's like to have their own pro football teams. While there are some small leagues in Europe, the WLAFA has given the three cities football clubs stocked with American players, American coaches and American off-field managers who have elevated the American game to a level the Europeans have not seen.

Sure, the NFL has had preseason games in Europe, but this is different. These games have meaning — in the standings and in the hearts of the fans.

A total of 35,000 loyal

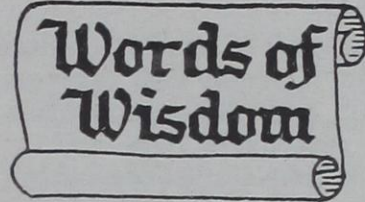
fans turned out in London on cold, rainy and windy day in Week 3 to cheer on their Monarchs on to a victory over Orlando. The crowd was larger than those for any English soccer matches that weekend.

Also, the fact that the European Division teams opened the season with the best records in the league didn't hurt this overseas courtship any.

Meanwhile, back in U.S., the fans' relationship with the new league has got off to a rocky start. Attendance has been erratic, television ratings have been a little

low and the most interest generated in the league has been for its use of the "quarterback cam."

# American Chronicle

**April 29, 1965** — Today, Francis Keppel, commissioner of education, ordered all public schools desegregated by the fall of 1967.

**April 30, 1900** — John Luther "Casey" Jones dies today at the throttle of the "Cannon Ball" express train traveling from Memphis, Tenn., to Canton, Miss. His final actions saved his passengers' lives.

**May 1, 1931** — President Hoover pushed a button in Washington, D.C., that turned on the lights of the Empire State Building in New York City. The building towers 1,245 feet above Fifth Avenue and 34th Street.

**May 2, 1923** — Lt. Oakley Kelley and Lt. John Macready departed Hempstead, Long Island, today for what would become the first non-stop transcontinental flight. The successful crew would land in San Francisco after flying nearly 2,800 miles.

**May 3, 1980** — "Genuine Risk" became the second filly to win the Kentucky Derby in its 106-year history. The first filly to win at Churchill Downs was "Regret" in 1915.

**May 4, 1927** — The Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences was formed today. One of the first functions of the 36 charter members, who included Douglas Fairbanks, Mary Pickford, Cecil B. DeMille and Irving Thalberg, was to organize the annual achievement awards.

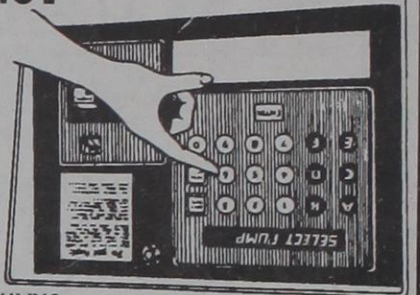

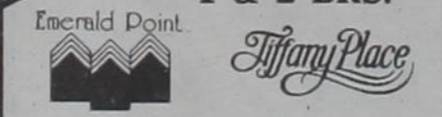

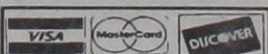
