MOSCOW - Konstantin Chernenko, a pillar of the Kremlin's old guard, was on Monday at the age of 72 - the oldest man ever to achieve the peak of Soviet
power. power.

It was not known if Chernenko would speak privately with Vice President
George Bush and Senate majority leader Howard Baker, who are representing the United States at Andropov's funeral. Speaking before the Central CommitCee, Chernenko attacked Western leaders as posing a threat of nuclear
war. He said the Soviet Union would strive to avert war by maintaining its nuclear strength.

he new general secretary does not yet have the extra title of president, with which Andropov and Brezhnev con-
solidated their power. The presidency probably will remain vacant until the

Supreme Soviet Parliament next meets. Pariiament elections are set for March 4 ,

Nobel laureate gives recipe for strong economy By REAGAN WHTTE
Advances in technology do not i crease unemployment and could cause unemployment only if all consumers
needs were fulfilled, visiting Nobel laureate Herbert Simon said Monday. Simon addressed a group of Texas Tech students and faculty at a press conerence in the University Center LubThe incre
industry has not led to an excessive unemployment rate, but to an unemployment rate similar to that of the United
States, Simon said. States, Simon said.
During the past century, the states has gone from employing 80 perent of the total population to a current evel of 3 percent, Simon said. But that trend has not left 77 percent of stead, people have moved into different kinds of work, fulfilling different economic demands.
Simon said several
Simon said several economic policies any economist will be able to present a different recipe for a healthy economy Economists need research to obtain nore clear-cut answers to economic ills, do to find answers to healing cancer, he said.
The major problem with creating a healthy economy is projecting future consumer trends such as demands fohe said. If that could be done, most economists would be able to come closer o agreement on other policies.
Simon said simpleminded Simon said simple-minded theories
concerning future trends in the concerning future trends in the
market are essentially useless. "The only information worth having is information no one else has; and once someone else has it, it will become useless acted on it," he said. Trends, such as the theory that antipipates a bull market in an election year, are no good, he said, and if
