Each department will be taken separately, all electives from the department will be listed and a summary of what each course involves and how it could be beneficial will be given.

The purpose of this series is twofold. For one thing, far too many students schedule elective courses haphazardly. In many cases, electives are selected during registration simply because the student needs three more hours to complete his schedule and the subject is offered at an hour when he can take

The result is he struggles through the subject probably with a low grade, because he is not interested in the subject and it has nothing to do with the field he plans to enter. However, he could probably be taking another elective,
perhaps one not related to his major, but one which would interest him

The second purpose is to give Techsans a general knowledge of the university they are attending and acquaint them with the various departments. Many students know very little about what Tech has to offer outside their major. There is a need to branch out and become acquaint-
ed with other facets of learning outside one's chosen field. A knowledge of electives should help eliminate the necessity of last minute consultations with major advisors and help students plan their own schedules.

We hope students will use this series on electives while planning their schedules and will select electives with more thought and consideration.
