Robbing The Clock

A RECENT ISSUE of The Toreador carried an editorial listing the qualities that a good instructor should possess. This editorial was commented upon favorably by several faculty members in their classes. But even those who aspire most heartily to filling these qualifications are found guilty of one fault—holding classes beyond the period when they are supposed to end.

Classes, according to college regulations, begin at five minutes past and continue until the same time before the hour. However, several professors find it necessary to prolong their lengthy lectures until the clock reaches the hour. Students have only five minutes to reach other classes, many of which may be held in buildings across the campus.

At Tech most instructors consider it anything from a lack of interest to an insult when their students are late for classes. Some of them go so far as to count four tardies as a cut. There are still others who give failing grades to students who, they contend, are habitually late. Instructors possess some points for a rebutat if their classes convene at eight o'clock in the morning or immediately following the lunch hour. But when a student attends a lecture from mine until ten o'clock and the next class on his schedule meets in another building under a professor who makes promptness one of his guages of grading, then a different story unravels itself. The student must drop the course or doggedly continue to meet the class, knowing that a professor's frown is the usual greeting and prejudice faces have so much interest in their courses. On the

On the other hand, instructors should prepare their lectures to fill the allotted time instead of imposing on that of the student. Especially should this be a truism when instructors pad their talks with laughless jokes and facts irrelevant to the course.




