Because of an act passed by the Tech Student Senate Thu sday, a proposal to create two Student Association (SA) vice president posts will be on the ballot in Wednesday's referendum,
The ballot will have two parts. If a student votes to give the $S A$ president power to appoint the secretary and business manage (both are now elected offices), then he can vote on the dual vice presidency proposal.
The Senate also approved Freshman Council plans to hold a referendum of freshman women on the abolition or retention of university-imposed hours for freshman women in the dorm.

acts. The sponsors of the acts had been unable earlier in the meeting to muster the two-thirds vote necessary to consider the legislation before it had been sent to committee.
Business Administration Senator Bill Sewell said he coauthored the dual vice-presidency act because "The SA presiden doesn't have time to implement programs he wants to initiate.
Sewell said the same plan has worked well at Rice University Under the proposal, there would be a vice-president for internal affairs and a vice-president for external affairs, both elected by the sturdents.

## Variety marks Gonzales' Speakers Series address <br> By HAL BROWN <br> Managing Editor

In an appearance for the University Speakers series Friday rom the state of politics in the United States today to the Tex stock fraud scandal.
Gonzales, who arrived half an hour late for the speech, began by reading a prepared text which began with a swipe a poiticians who depend on poiitical
"One of the unhappy things in politics, at least in the recent past, is that candidates are paying more attention to technique and less and less to issues," Gonzales said Gonzales pointed to the book, "The Selling of the President, which reveals the tactics used in the Nixon campaign of 1968 . who now 'worry too much about how to get into office and not enough about what they are going to do once they are elected. Gonzales said this type of campaigning "obscures the basis of politics-issues," and soon leads to an electorate such as we have oday which he said has a mood of "frustration without anger. candidate to be elected in our system.
Gonzales then turned his attention to the rights of minorities in our political system, which he praised for "protecting the rights of minorities 99 point 9 per cent of the time, if not better. "Minorities are the engine of change, the instrument which makes the majority accountable for its actions," Gonzales saic
Gonzales said he didn't favor forming "power blocs" ethnic minorities but rather favored building support from a small base of supporters theen seeking constantly to add to the
base until gaining a majority.
Gonzales attributed his political successes to following the latter course and said he was elected on the basis of his stand on
issues confronting the electorate. issues confronting the electorate.
Being of Mexican descent, Gon
on his campaigns. "The electorate is more interested in issues that the candidate's last name," he asserted.
In a question and answer session after his prepared speech, Congressman Gonzales said he felt the three most critical problems facing the U.S. at this time were the lack of policy in
Southeast Asia; the economy (foreign and domestic) and a need Southeast Asia; the economy (foreign and domestic) and a need
for a clear cut long range definition of domestic problems such as education and employment. Gonzales said the greatest problems vere in the United States' role as a world leader.
