Salary Increases Recommended For College Faculties

Recommendations for salary increases for college faculties have been made by Texas Commission on Higher Education to the 55th Texas Legislature. Recommended increases range from \$750 to \$800 annually for the next two years.

"The Commission said that salaries of the 18 state-supported colleges and universities should be made more competitive with comparable state institutions outside the state." Dr. E. N. Jones said before a faculty meeting in Tech Union Building Thursday.

Dr. Jones stated that increases will not be near the requests made by Tech administrative officials to the Legislature.

Tech requested 29.88 per cent

Tech requested 29.88 per cent increase for teaching salaries only, which included a 17 per cent across-the-board raise for the fac-ulty.

The Budget Board reduced Tech's legislative appropriation request of \$6,164,549 for 1957-58, a 45.2 increase over the 1956-57 budget, to \$4,627,738.

Dr. Jones said Tech's average salary is \$4,829. Tech ranks eighth in average salaries among the 18 state-supported schools


