The Texas Tech campus will come alive with the spirit of Christmas Dec. 1 when more than 15,000 red, yellow and white Christmas bulbs outlining ten buildings set the campus' distinctive Spanish architecture aglow the warmth and beauty of the holiday season.

Although the annual Carol of Lights began 30 years ago when former Board Regent Harold Hinn donated the first 5,000 lights for lighting the west engineering, social science, chemistry and administration buildings, the tradition did not adopt its current name until 1961.

Gene Hemmle, who co-founded the event, said he and several other professors decided it would be nice if a group of students and faculty members could gather at the circle and sing Christmas Carols.

The ceremony now includes special dinners, music by several choirs, instrumental ensembles and the audience singing as street lights dim and the magical night bursts into a kaliedscope of color. Luminarios lining the streets and the unusual walkways of Memorial Circle along with a silent procession of torch-bearing Saddle Tramps enhance the solemity of the Carol of Lights ceremony which has become an important part of the community but for the entire Lubbock area.

Following the Carol of Lights ceremony, wassail and signal the beginning of the entertainment. Christmas music will be provided in the University Library's Croslin Room as a brass quintet plays Christmas tunes. Sponsored by the Friends of the University Library/Southwest Collection, the event is open to the public and free of charge.

The University Choir and the University Singers from Mackey. the School of Music will perform a free concert in the Hemmle Recital Hall of the Music Building.

The campus will remain illuminated from 6 p.m. to campus. midnight through Jan. 1, so the community can continue to enjoy the fantastic visual presentation the campus presents.

Monopoly sales pass 100 million

Since being introduced in introduced in 1935, Parker Brothers has sold more than 100 million sets. The game, invented by a man named Charles B. Darrow during a spell of unemployment in 1933, now is distributed in 35 countries and in 19 languages.

Silly Putty developed by accident

Silly Putty was invented accidentally in a General Electric Company lab during World War II, when scientists were trying to develop synthetic rubber for the war effort. Besides providing an instant medium for fledgling sculptors, this substance has been used to pick lint, clean typewriter keys, level wobbly furniture, help the Apollo 8 astronauts fasten down tools during weightless flight, and to take hand and foot prints of the gorilla population at the Columbus, Ohio Zoo.

Yo-vo: weapon turned toy

One of the oldest toys is the yo-yo, with origins in a primitive weapon used by prehistoric Filipino hunters. The original version had a sharp piece of flint attached to a long thong. If the hunter's aim was poor, he could retrieve the weapon and try again.

Teddy bear named for president

The Teddy Bear, a namesake of President Theodore Roosevelt, originated in 1902 when the president refused to kill a bear that his hunting party had captured and tied up for him to shoot. Roosevelt said it would be unsportsmanlike to take advantage of the defenseless animal.

The Christmas tree in New York's Rockefeller Center lights up (with 18,000 colored bulbs) in midtown Manhattan. 


