CAMPUS JUSTICE

Examinations are upon us with the many opportunities for mental larceny. We will be tested for what we are as well as for what we know. Perhaps the former is the more important test, for Honor is a prerequisite for true Scholarship. A diploma from a college where cheating is the accepted mode of passing examinations is of doubtful value. If cheating continues as it is in some classes the practice will spread, and the inevitable result will be low value for a diploma from Tech. Communities needing college men and women will look elsewhere.

Whether or not the situation is equally as serious at other colleges we do not know, but whatever the condition may be in other schools, there is no excuse for its continuance here. Regardless of how much cribbing we have at Tech there is too much! At its best, cheating is not a desirable thing. It is a degenerating and disintegrating factor in one's life. It must be eliminated.

What are the solutions? Monitors, traps, expulsion honor systems, examinations of a type that renders cheating, etc. ad infinitum? Many solutions have been tried, and many have failed. Those that have failed have depended too much on the use of external force and on impracical systems. The change must come from within the student body—from those students who do not cheat and from those students who do.

We must rise to the responsibility for eliminating mental larceny. The initiative is in our hands and rightly so. If a strong, influential group of students at Tech will say, "We will have no cheating," it will be practically eliminated. Decision on this issue is determined by the attitude students assume toward the thief, Is he to be regarded as a shrewd fellow, who puts it over on the instructor, or is he to be honored as a martyr, if caught? Too long has justice been blinded and democracy crippled by the bullying of a visionless, selfish group of cheats, who profit on the labor of friends and jeopardize the future of our school. When will college citizens have the vision to see that

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
