COACHES ALSO TO STAY WITH MATADORS UNDER NEW AGREEMENT

All football men and possibly other athletes will room and board in a special dormitory next year according to a contract between the college athletic council and the management of Cheri Casa dormitory for room and board. The dormitory is one of the most up to date in the state and, having been recently refinished throughout, will provide excellent housing quarters for the athletes. There are thirty two-capacity rooms and five apartments. This will accommodate some sixty athletes, as well as two of the coaches. The coaches will occupy two of the larger apartments.

According to the present plan, if there are not enough athletes to fill

According to the present plan, if there are not enough athletes to fill the building in the fall term, others will be admitted to the dormitory only by special permission from the college. The idea of having the football men and coaches under the same roof was advanced by Pete Cawthon and is regarded by many as the most progressive move yet advanced in the bettering of Tech Athletics, and in enforcing training rules.

Action on the budget needs of Texas Tech for the biennium, presented for consideration to the State board of education, has been postponed until July. The needs listed in the proposed budget for the college totaled \$3, 345, 430.

Bearing with him all data regarding the needs of the college, Tom Garrard, Lubbock, left this city Sunday for Austin to submit the items for the consideration of the State board and Dr. Paul W. Horn, president of Tech, arrived in Austin Monday to support these needs.

A number of new building improvements including a library, a dairy products unit, and an enlargement of the Administration building, are provided for in the request of \$1,221,300 for building proposed.


