

## IFC Airs New Type Rush Plan Tramps Set All Red Day

The new concept of a "semi-deferred" rush system headlined discussion at Wednesday's meeting of the Interfraternity Council.

IFC President Gary Lawrence introduced the measure as a possible substitute for Tech's current pre-rush procedures.

### PLEDGE IN NOVEMBER

If the new plan is approved by Tech's 11-member fraternity system, rush will start at the opening of the fall semester, and rush-ees will be pledged sometime in November.

**UNDER THE** plan, a pledge's fall semester grades will not be included in his initiation requirements, and his spring semester grades will determine his standing. Therefore, a person pledging in the fall will be under control of his chosen fraternity for approximately one year, or at least one full semester.

According to Lawrence, "... this method will allow the fraternities to look over prospective members and see if they will work out. Also, it gives the student time to adapt to college work and learn how to get his work done," Lawrence added.

### ADOPTED BY COUNCIL

The motion was adopted by the IFC for the purpose of presenting the idea to the individual fraternity chapters for discussion and evaluation. More work will be done on this particular rush idea at upcoming IFC meetings.

**OTHER RUSH** news discussed at the meeting included the matter of semester grade slips for prospective pledges.

For the first time this year, those interested in going through rush must pick up their grade slips in the registrars office and turn them in to the fraternity advisor's office before 5 p.m. Friday.

Spring rush officially begins at 1 a.m. Saturday and will run through Saturday, Feb. 29.

# Folk Singer To Perform

Folk singer Leon Bibb brings his vocal talents to the Municipal Auditorium at 8:15 p.m. Friday.

Tickets, purchased from the special events committee of the Tech Union, are 75 cents for Tech students, \$1 for special students and faculty and \$2 for the general public.

### SINGER, INTERPRETER

Bibb, both a singer and interpreter of songs, performs folk songs, ballads and Broadway show tunes.

**BORN IN** Louisville, Ky., he at-

tended Louisville Municipal College, where he was featured soloist with the college glee club.

Following military service, Bibb began studying voice in New York and working toward a theatrical career. He was cast in the Rodgers and Hammerstein production of Irving Berlin's "Annie Get Your Gun," starring Ethel Merman. Later Bibb joined the touring company of "Finian's Rainbow."

### SANG IN CHORUS

Returning to New York, he was cast in the Kurt Weill Maxwell Anderson musical hit, "Lost in the Stars," in which he sang in the chorus and understudied the leading role.

**BIBB APPEARED** in an acting part in "Flight Into Egypt," directed by Elia Kazan, and then worked two seasons at New York's Phoenix Theatre. He played a feature role in the production of "Sandhog" and had the role of Jim in "Livin' the Life," a musical version of "Huckleberry Finn."

For the past four years, Bibb has performed for concerts and in night clubs. He has appeared on the Ed Sullivan Show, The Tonight Show, Hootenanny and several other television variety programs. His solo concert performances

have brought him to Town Hall in New York, the University of Vermont Concert Series, the University of Minnesota, the University of Texas, Washington and Lee University and other colleges.

## DEMOS OPPOSE BOARD'S CHOICE

The Lubbock County Young Democrats unanimously adopted a strongly worded resolution Wednesday expressing active opposition to the name Texas Tech University.

The resolution, proposed without prior action by the Resolutions Committee, was accepted for discussion and adopted by a voice vote, according to Mike Read, president.

Prior to the introduction of the resolution, Bobby M. Brown made a non-political speech on the history and purposes of the club. Brown, currently a candidate for state legislature, is a former vice president of the club and one of its founders.

## Journalists Broadcast Tech News

The Texas Tech Journalism Department is currently sponsoring a campus news program Monday through Friday on Lubbock radio station KLBK (1340).

The five-minute broadcasts, which began Monday, are presented at 6 p.m. and feature only campus news. News reports are prepared in the newsroom of the Daily Toreador.

Expenses are paid by the Lubbock radio station. The only equipment required for the program is a direct telephone line to the radio station's studios.

According to Phil Orman, director of student publications, the program was proposed by Paul R. Bean, formerly of KLBK. Arthur N. Redinger, Olton sophomore, is announcer.

"It's hoped the news program will gain popularity as we gain experience," Orman said. "We plan to feature taped news interviews as part of the program in the future," he added.

Orman said he did not think the Toreador newscasts would interfere with the broadcasts of KTXT, the college radio station, since the campus station is FM.

## Dr. Strain To Address Young GOP's Friday

Dr. Dudley Strain will speak at the Young Republicans' noon forum Friday. His topic will be "Separation of Church and State."

Since 1953 Dr. Strain has been the pastor of Lubbock's First Christian Church. He received his masters degree and his B.D. degree at Yale University. He did his graduate work at Butler University, and received an Honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree from Texas Christian University.

He has served as president of the State Convention of Christian Churches and president of the Texas Board of Christian Churches. He is the author of a book, to be published under the title "The Measure of a Minister." Dr. Strain also writes the syndicated column "Prayer for Today."

The forum will be in the Blue Room of Tech Union. Cost of the

meal will be 75 cents. Reservations should be made at the newsstand in the Union before 10 a.m. Friday.

LONDON (AP) — The British government announced tonight it will fly nearly 2,000 more troops to strife-torn Cyprus Thursday to keep the peace there until an international force is formed.

They will reinforce between 5,000 and 6,000 British troops who have been trying to keep the Greek and Turkish Cypriots from each other's throats since Christmas-time.

The annual school trip, set for March 26-April 1, is open to all students, and is sponsored by the Tech Union Entertainment Committee.

"Students will have an opportunity to create goodwill among the Mexican people, plus act as cultural ambassadors," Bill Bledsoe, committee member, said.

The Tech Symphony Orchestra will present a concert in Monterrey during the student visit and Techsans will have an opportunity to attend the performance.

An informal meeting is set for

7 p.m. in the Mesa Room of Tech Union on Feb. 25.

Students can make reservations for the trip in the Union lobby or Program Office until March 2. Total trip cost is \$90, with \$25 due at registration and the remainder before March 2.

Refunds will be made if cancellations are turned in prior to March 5. The complete fee includes round trip transportation by chartered bus, five nights' lodging, all sightseeing tour tickets and one nightclub tour with dinner.

The students will stay in downtown Monterrey at the El Paso Hotel. A swimming pool, dining room and soda fountain will be available for their use.

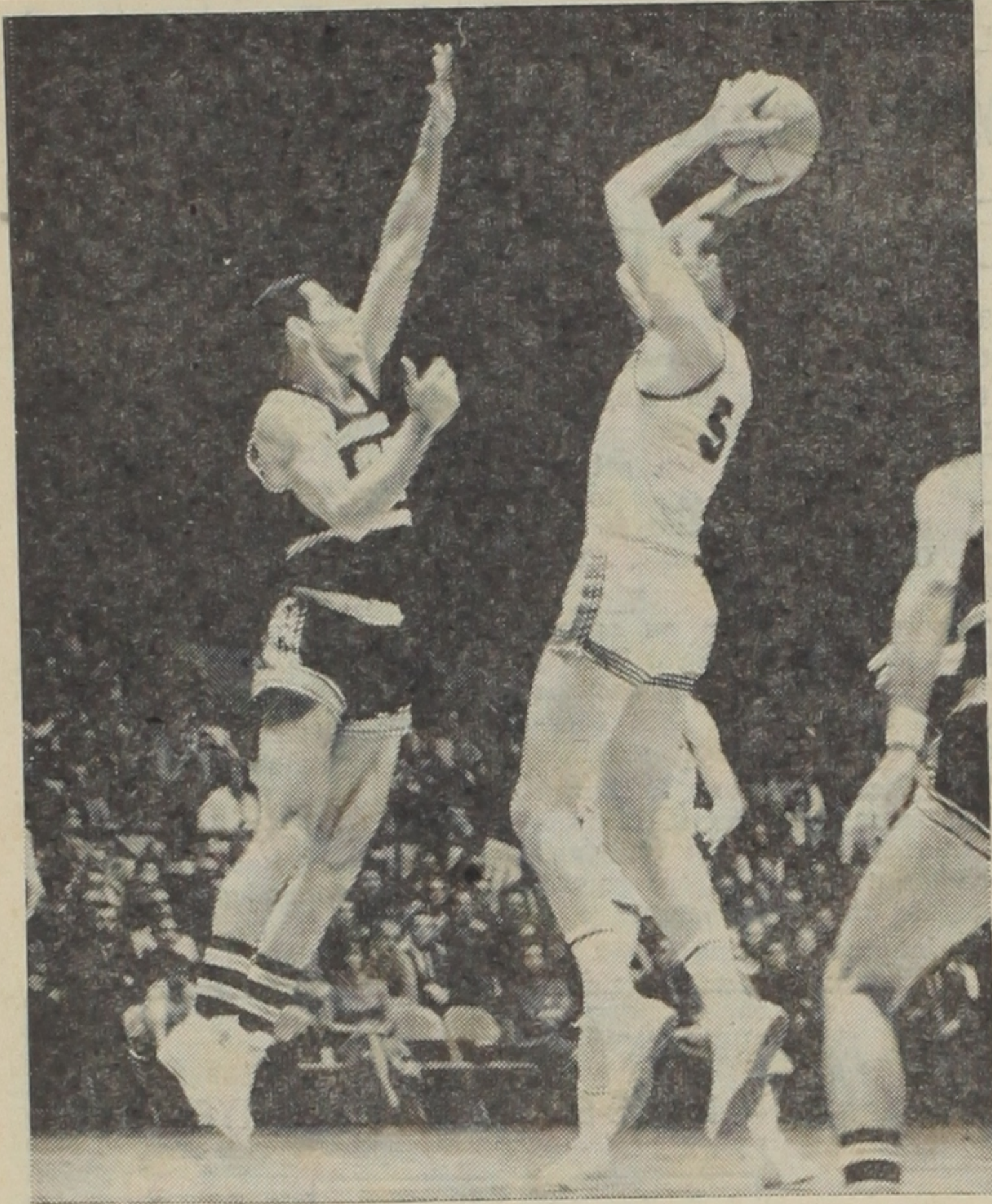

With his 30 point effort against Texas Christian, Dub Malaise boosted his Southwest Conference scoring average to 19.8 and crept within three points of Harold Denney for the season high scoring total.

Denney continues to hold down the top spot in the rebounding department, pulling in 156 for the season and 86 in SWC competition.

All five of Tech's starters are still in double figures, as the Raider squad continues to lead the Conference in scoring.

## SWC Race Moves To Last Round

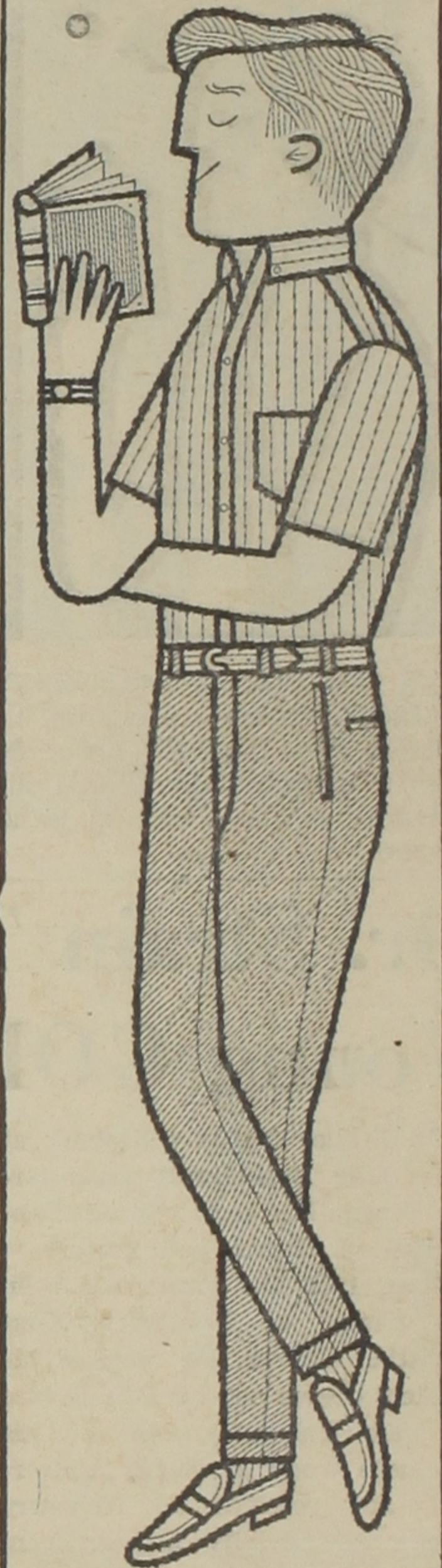
Southwest Conference basketball moves into its closing rounds Saturday with only two teams completely out of any chance to at least tie for the SWC title.

## Swim Team Begins Trip

Tech's swim team begins a three-meet invasion of the Rocky Mountain region today when they take on Denver University in the Pioneer's pool at 4 p.m.

The Raiders then take on the University of Colorado in Boulder at 7:30 p.m. Friday and conclude the trip with a dual contest against Colorado College and Air Force Academy in Boulder at 2 p.m. Saturday.

The match with Denver was scheduled for earlier this year, but was cancelled because of bad weather. Then Colorado State College and Colorado Mines cancelled their scheduled meet with the Raiders Thursday and the Denver match was rescheduled for that date.

Last year Tech edged Colorado twice, 48-46 and 48-47, but lost to Denver, 56-39, and Air Force, 63-32.

Tech is now 1-7 for the season, having snapped its losing streak Saturday by downing Texas A&M at College Station, 57-41.

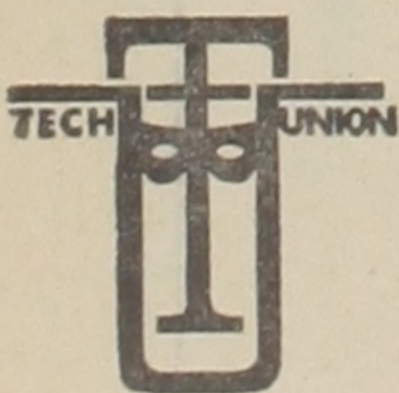
Losses have been to Colorado State University, University of Kansas, Oklahoma, Southern Methodist, Eastern New Mexico, New Mexico and Texas.

Heading the Tech entries is Phil Simpkins, defending Southwest Conference 100-yard freestyle champion and All-American swim team candidate.

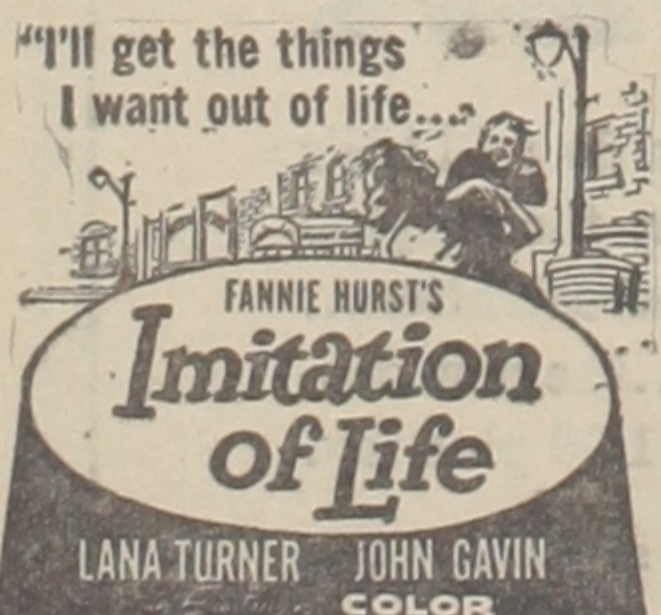
