A FEW years ago Henry Ford visited the town where he spent his childhood and found in the little schoolhouse the same desk he had used. He knew it was his because the initials "H. F." were still deeply prominent where he had carved them as a boy. No doubt the school is proud of that desk, but can everyone be sure that his name will be as valuable as Henry Ford's several years from now?

The modern American college is far removed from the "In School Days" building of many years ago, but there are still those who insist upon carving their names into the future through the medium of school property.




