Absentee balloting is almost completed throughout Texas and students who are not legal residents of Lubbock County will find themselves unable to vote very soon. That is unless they are going to be home in the middle of the week ... a rather unlikely happening.

The procedure is very simple. First of all, a student must send a self-addressed envelope to the county clerk of his particular county. Then a ballot will be returned to him to be filled out and returned immediately.

For Lubbock students the method of voting amounts to waiting until Nov. 6 and then merely taking the trouble to go the precinct polls

While voting is being done, it would be a good idea to come to the aid of Tech by casting a vote for amendment three to the Texas Constitution which would allow more money to Tech in the next 20 years.
