

GOV. FERGUSON SUPPORTS THE TECH

The fact that Gov. Miriam A. Ferguson is still co-operating with the college authorities in making the first year of the Texas Tech a decided success was substantiated by her action in signing the deficiency warrant presented by R. M. Chitwood, business manager of the institution. Mrs. Ferguson has been liberal in her support of the appropriations for the Tech, and the press of the state on last Sunday carried the announcement of her latest official action in the interest of the college.

Manager Chitwood made the announcement upon his return from Austin last week that Gov. Ferguson would ap prove the request, and the word was received with great enthusiasm here. The deficiency warrant amounted to \$58,180 and will be used in caring for the large enrollment. This will care for the salaries of the new instructors and general expenses, the appropriations for these purposes being insufficient.
