## Cars Stolen Here Found In Granbury

Maurice Rendon and R.C. Smith were two surprised people last Friday morning when they received phone calls from Police Chief Carlos Torres to inform them that their stolen cars had been taken into custody. It seems they were unaware of the thefts until Torres called to confirm that their cars were stolen. Hood County officials had notified Torres that they had the vehicles.

According to Chief Torres, Hood County law officials became suspicious of the vehicles when they were noticed being driven in an unsafe manner and the drivers speeded away when the lawmen tried to stop them. The lawmen

took chase and apprehended one vehicle in Granbury, the 1988 Pontiac belonging to Smith. The driver, Abraham Garcia, 18, and a juvenile passenger were taken into custody. The other vehicle, a 1977 Buick belonging to Rendon, headed for Fort Worth where the Ft. Worth PD picked it up along with two juveniles who were in the vehicle. Torres was notified of their apprehension at about 3:30 a.m. Friday morning.

Both vehicles were damaged. According to Torres the suspects also attempted to break into vehicles at Glenn Herrod's Car Lot and burglarized a building there.

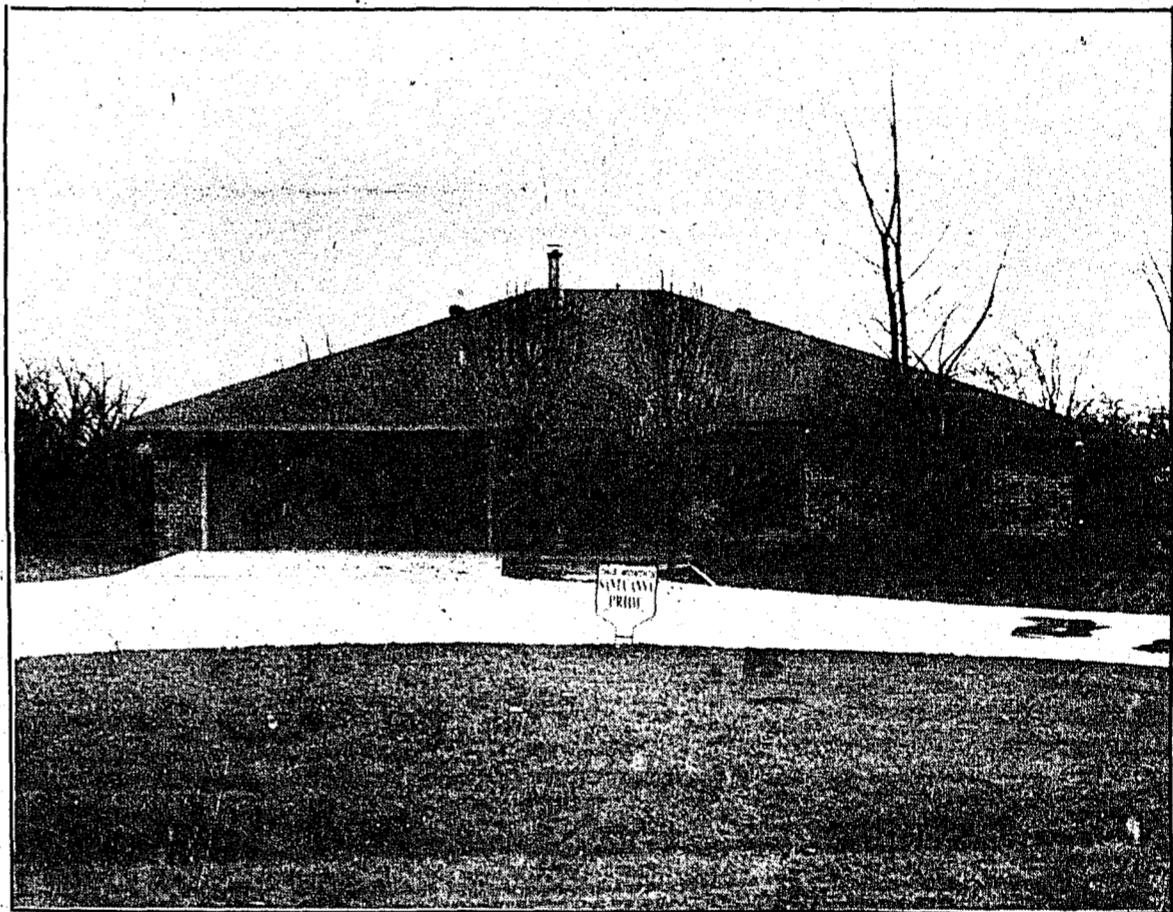

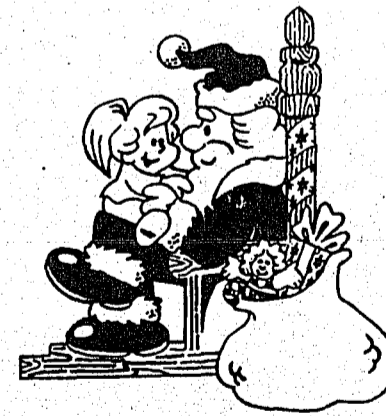

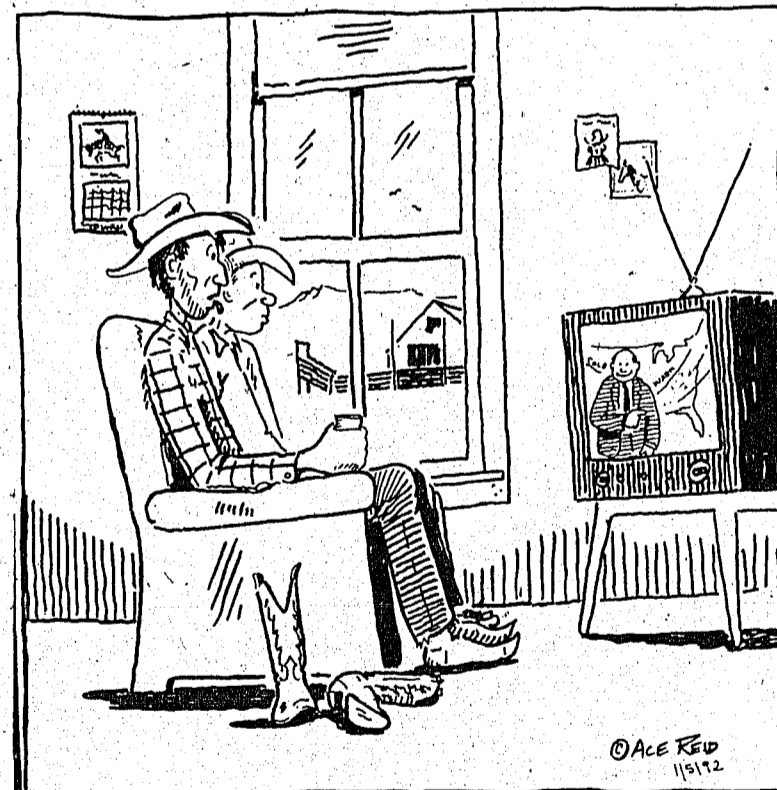

## Dickson To Run Again

State Senator Temple Dickson has asked the Santa Anna News to announce to our readers that he will seek re-election next year to carry on the task he started in 1989 of making Texas Government more responsive to the people it represents.

"Three years ago, I was elected state senator with a promise to be a lawmaker who is responsive to the needs and concerns of the people in the 24th Senate District," Dickson said. "I hope we have fulfilled that promise but the need for an effective senator to serve the interests of our rural district and its population centers has not diminished.

"I will continue to be at the forefront of rural economic development efforts for Texas if I am re-elected," he said. "I also plan to continue to pursue changes in the state's criminal justice system to stop the early release from prison of dangerous felons."

During his first term, Dickson was appointed chairman of the Senate Economic Development Committee by Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock. The senator made use of this appointment by overseeing the restructuring of the Texas Department of Commerce to include the creation of a Rural Economic Development Division to bring services to rural Texas. Dickson also was recently named to both regional and national economic development committees.

Offering full support to the Texas State Technical College System which offers vital technical training to students, Dickson was able to retain state funding for an Abilene campus, increase funding for the Abilene, Sweetwater and Breckenridge sites, and pass legislation creating a Brownwood TSTC campus.

"The rural areas of this state can only remain competitive in today's economy if its residents have access to quality vocational and technical education," Dickson said. "I am a strong supporter of the TSTC system because it helps rural Texans find jobs, open businesses and contribute to the state's future."

Dickson introduced legislation earlier this year to toughen sentences for the most serious crimes and worked on several efforts to locate new state prisons in his district. He authored and sponsored new state laws mandating alcohol education for juveniles convicted of alcohol-related crimes and setting aside state prison beds for treatment of alcohol and other drug abusers.

"I remain deeply concerned about the chaos in the state's criminal justice system and I will not rest until I know the good citizens of Texas are protected from criminal acts," Dickson said. "We need to treat the causes of criminal acts, such as alcohol and drug abuse, while we make sure punishments are suitably strict."

Dickson is serving on the Texas Punishment Standards Commission charged with overhauling laws on crime and punishment.

Several organizations have recognized Dickson's work to support and strengthen law enforcement. He was named 1991 Senator of the Year by the largest association of working law officers in the state—the Combined Law Enforcement Associations of Texas. Dickson also has been honored by the Texas Prosecu-

tor's Association — where he was named a Legislator of the Year for 1991.

Kathy Dickson has served as advisor to her husband for the past four years and is vice chairman of the Center for Rural Health Initiatives. The Dicksons, married for 34 years, have four daughters and three grandchildren.

Dickson is a long-time Sweetwater rancher and lawyer whose father and grandfather served in elected state office. He served as state representative from Sweetwater from 1965 to 1971, sponsoring legislation which created the Texas State Technical College, improved highway safety and promoted water and soil conservation.

Jim Rose, owner of Rose and Sons Construction in Abilene, will serve as Dickson's campaign treasurer.

## Capitol Comments

AUSTIN, DEC. 12.—Redistricting has continued to evade an acceptable solution, thus a mixed bag of concerns and complications continue to make life in the Texas legislature interesting. The US Justice Department recently gave tentative approval on the Texas House redistricting plan, with five exceptions. These exceptions are the El Paso, Dallas, spots in the Valley, and the San Antonio areas. MALDEF attorneys contend that more Mexican American districts should be created, and that the recent census was drastically undercounted. As of this week, it appears that some last minute agreements have been reached, and perhaps the House plan is actually going to be finalized. It appears that District 73 (the new district), which I have previously described will include Brown, Coleman, and fourteen other West Texas Counties. This plan covers lots of geography, but does not couple me with another incumbent state legislator, and leaves 38% - 40% of the entire district population in Brown and Coleman Counties. I personally feel that the plan is good for the district and good for me. The filing date, which should have been Dec. 3rd has been delayed, pending approval of the redistricting plan, so, at this time, it is unclear when filing for office might actually begin. This probably means that the party primary elections will be delayed beyond the March 10th date.

The public school finance plan was heard by the Texas Supreme Court on November 19th, and an opinion is expected by the end of December. It is expected by many that the County Education Districts (CED's) will probably be ruled unconstitutional. This seems to leave only one option, as the Court's have previously indicated, and that would be a state wide property tax, which would be assessed, collected and distributed at a state level. This means that locally we will have

even less input and control than with the CED plan. I take issue with the Court's decision that each student in the state should have equal access and availability to property tax base dollars in every school district; this is not what our state constitution guarantees.

Our state constitution states that every child in Texas will have access to a quality, free public education, and I contend that the Court's interpretation is not realistic, or legally binding. Now, the outcome remains to be seen.

Governor Ann Richards has created a new Health Care Task Force consisting of 26 members. Speaker Gib Lewis appointed me as a member of this new Task Force. Health care - availability, accessibility and affordability - is part of the major issues facing Texas and the Nation, as well.

I am extremely pleased to have been appointed to serve on this task force.

As you well know, we in the rural areas of Texas have a unique set of concerns and problems with health care, such as availability of doctors, and closure of rural hospitals - to name a couple. It should come as no secret to you that the majority of the Task Force are from urban areas, and very little representation given rural areas.
