Mountaineers Slip By Indians,

In a flag throwing defensive battle the Santa Anna Mountaineers held off the Jim Ned Indians to win by a close 13-7.

All the scoring took place in the first half with all of the Mountaineers scoring coming in the first quarter. Danny Williams set the Mountaineers up for their first score when he intercepted a Jim Ned pass. He returned the ball from the Indian 44 to the 14. It took Dale Herring three plays to get Santa Anna its first touchdown with Tommy Blanton kicking the extra point. With 9:47 left in the first period the Mountaineers had a 7-0 lead:

Three minutes later the Mountaineers had the ball again on their own 38 yard line.
