Voters Urged To Polls Tuesday Cent. Catholic Nips Mountaineers 9 - 6

Next Tuesday, November 5, is election day, and voting is expected to be heavy here, as is usual for a presidential election. The polling place for Santa Anna and its consolidated area will be in the Lions Club building, with the polls to open at 8:00 a. m. and close at 7:00 p. m.

Glen Copeland will serve as election judge and W. L. Vaughan, alternate judge. Clerks for the election will be Mrs. C. D. Bruce, Mrs. Helen Stepp, Mrs. Carmen Donham, Mrs. Billie Guthrie, Mrs. Loren Rice, Mrs. Richard Horner, Mrs. Judy Hartman, and Thomas Wristen, Jr.

Other voting places for Precinct 2 will be at Rockwood, Shields, and for the first time in Coleman. People in the newly revised precincts will be voting at the new places, making Coleman the polling place for a number of area people who live just north of the mountain and in the Mayo and Buffalo communities.

Other people in the original Pct. 2 to be affected by this change will be a few families in the Redbank Community who will now vote in Pct. 3 instead of at Shields. Those in doubt about their place to vote should check with the election judge in their area. All eligible voters are urged to get out and vote Tuesday and also to bring their registration slips with them.

Election Ballot Change May Confuse Some Voters

Two factors may cause some balloting confusion in the November 5 general election, election officials in Texas forecast this week.

The two factors are:
1. A new State law has inserted a new top line on the paper ballots so that persons desiring to vote a "straight party ticket" may do so by making one mark. This new line is expected to confuse not only the "straight ticket" voters, but also the "split ticket" voters.
2. "Split ticket" voters are expected to be more numerous than ever before, especially since there is a third party, the American Party, and it has candidates for only President and Vice-President and no other offices.

Voters are cautioned to be certain that their ballots are properly marked so that their intentions will not be subject to interpretation by election officials.

The "scratch" method of voting, which some people prefer, is still permitted. However, voters using this method are cautioned to be certain to mark through all names in all three party columns for which they do not wish to vote.

There are 19 counties in Texas that use voting machines. As in the past, one lever can be pulled to vote a "straight ticket." To vote a "split ticket," individual levers should be pulled for each candidate of the voter's choice. Persons who are uncertain as to how to operate a machine should contact one of the election officials before entering the voting booth.

Voting machines are scheduled to be used in the following counties: Bell, Bexar, Brazoria, Cameron, Dallas, Ector, El Paso, Galveston, Gregg, Harris, Hidalgo, Jefferson, Midland, Mueses, Potter, Randall, Rusk, Smith and Tarrant.

Special Mail Service For Christmas

Santa Anna Postmaster John Gregg has received notice of a special mail service to the Armed Forces in Viet Nam for Christmas. The venture is a joint Pentagon-Post Office project designated "1968 Santa Claus Special."

A fast U. S. Cargo ship will sail from Oakland, Calif., next month with Christmas parcels for our servicemen in Viet Nam. The ship will stop at Da Nang, Qui Nhon, Cam Rahn Bay, and Saigon.

It takes approximately three weeks for a fast ship to cross the ocean, so the shipment will leave about the latter part of November.

To meet the sailing deadline and assure pre-holiday delivery of gifts, items should be marked "SANTA CLAUS SPECIAL" just below the stamps. All gifts should be packed in strong containers with adequate cushioning and correctly addressed, including APO and FPO numbers. All items should be mailed before November 9.

There are several ways to mail to the military which will save money, and pamphlets outlining the mailing programs for servicemen can be picked up at the local post office.

Postmaster Gregg also urges local post office patrons to mail all other Christmas mail as early as possible. Early mail can be labeled "NOT TO BE OPENED UNTIL CHRISTMAS." The proper address including zip code should be on all mail.
