Disaster Funds Available For Storm Damage
Farmers who received damage ohail storm on Monday evening September 27 , are reminded that disaster applications must be filed with the ASCS office within 15 days of the date of the disaster. If the crop is not worth keeping, the disaster application should be 1976. An appraisal will then be made on the acreage to determine the loss in production. Producers are reminded to not destroy the crop prior to the appraisal on the acreage (including grazing). It is very important that farmers meet the above requirement to remain eligible for disaster payments. Anyone who is not sure of what to do should contact the ASCS office in Coleman, Texas.
