Coleman County Included In **OCD** Funding

Governor Dolph Briscoe announced recently the approval of an Office of Child Development grant for \$202,430 in new federal funds to Central Texas Opportunities, Inc. in Coleman.

The grant includes \$142,745 in new funds and authorization to use \$590 in carryover funds for parttime Head Start, and \$59,685 in new funds and authorization to use \$113 in carryover funds for full-day Head Start. Funded under Title V of the Head Start, Economic Opportunity, and Community Partnership Act of 1974, the grant is effective retroactively from May 1, 1977 through April 30, 1978.

One hundred and twenty children from low income families will be served in the part day program which operates from September through April. The children are served in six classes which last for six hours a day, five days a week. The classes will be held in centers in Ballinger, Coleman and Brownwood.

The full-day Head Start program will serve 60 children in Brady, Winters and Brownwood.



Variety tests on wheat and oats in Coleman County have been harvested and the results are now available for producers interested in yields. The top four wheat varieties (demonstration on Hurschel Dunn farm) were 1st-Sage with 20.8 bushels per acre; 2nd - Fox with 20.1 bushels per acre; 3rd - Centurk with 19.3 bushels per acre; and 4th -Homestead with 18.8 bushels per

An oat and barley variety demonstration was carried out by Keith Phillips. Results for oats were: 1st - TAMO-312 with 68.4 bushels per acre; 2nd - Nora with 63.2 bushels per acre; and 3rd -TAMO-301 with 41.9 bushels per

Barley results were 1st - Will, 30.5 bushels per acre; 2nd - Era with 21.3 bushels per acre; and 3rd - Tambar 401 with 20.8 bushels per acre.

On a two-year average the best wheat for Coleman County was Fox with a 21.8 bushel per acre average. Second was TAMW 101 with a 21.4 bushels per acre; third was Sage with 21.0 bushel yield; and fourth was Centurk with a 19.4 average.

Anyone wishing complete report on tests and yeilds of varieties may pick them up free of charge from the County Extension Office, according to Roger Blackmon, County Extension






Afternoon Shower Gives Brief Relief

Santa Anna Volunteer Firemen under control when the local ave been busy during the past firemen arrived.




