The lovely old home of Mrs. Lee Hunter has been completely re-painted during the past weeks - no easy job for the large, ornate two-story home.

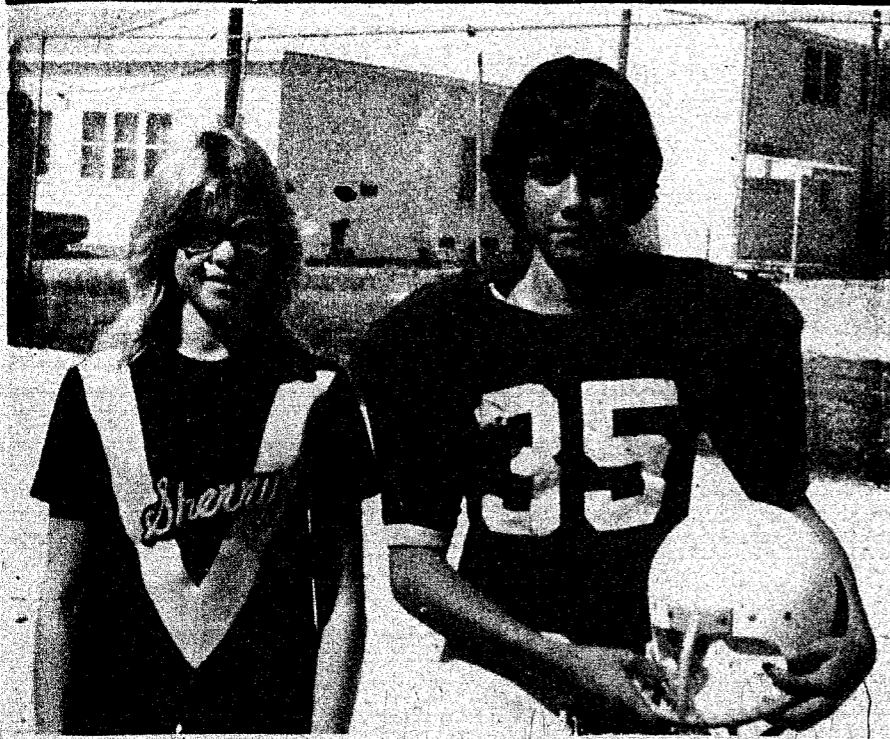
Mrs. Hunter reported to a friend that the new paint job cost more than the original construction of the home in 1904!
