The annual Santa Anna 4-H and FFA Stock Show will be held Saturday, December 30, at the new show barn on the school campus. Judging is slated to start at 9 a.m. that morning.

About 50 entries will be included in the judging, well under the number in previous years. Larry Smith, vocational agriculture teacher at Brownwood, will judge the four divisions.

The Santa Anna Livestock Association is sponsor of the local show, with Tom Newman to serve as show superintendent.

The Coleman County 4-H and FFA stock show is to be held January 7-9.

The Santa Anna High School boys basketball team took their second straight tournament championship, winning the title at the Rising Star contests last weekend.

The local boys defeated the Rising Star team in the championship game Saturday night 72-44. Terry Day led the Mountaineers with 18 points.

The boys won over the DeLeon team 44-35 in the first round of play with Tommy Harris leading with 13 points. In the second game they defeated the Albany team 55-37 with Harris scoring 16 and Dick Smith scoring 14.

Terry Day, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Bill Day, was named to the All-Tournament team at the close of the tourney.

The Santa Anna girls lost in the consolation game to the Rising Star girls Saturday night 28-20 with Gayla Pritchard leading with seven points. Gayla, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Don Pritchard was named to the All-Tournament team.

The local girls lost in the first round of play to the DeLeon girls,

36-23 with Gayla scoring 12 points. They won over the Cross Plains girls 30-23 on Friday with Gayla again leading the local scoring.

In other games last week, the Santa Anna boys won their first two district games, defeating Mozelle 57-43 on Tuesday. Terry Day, Dick Smith and Bruce Pape had 13, 12 and 11 points respectively.

Thursday night at Richland Springs the Santa Anna boys won 86-25 with Smith the top scorer.

The Santa Anna girls lost to Mozelle 29-25 with Lori Herring leading the scoring. Santa Anna defeated the Richland Springs girls 30-21 Thursday with Gayla Pritchard scoring 13.

The Mountaineers lost a game last week to the Brownwood State School team, 55-42. Coach Pete Simmons praised the local team for their good game against the strong Brownwood group, and is looking for a victory in a re-match on January 2 at Brownwood.

The district play resumes Friday, January 5, with games with Talpa-Centennial.

There will be no issue of the NEWS next week, the annual vacation for the staff in our office. The office will be closed most of the week and again Monday, January 1.

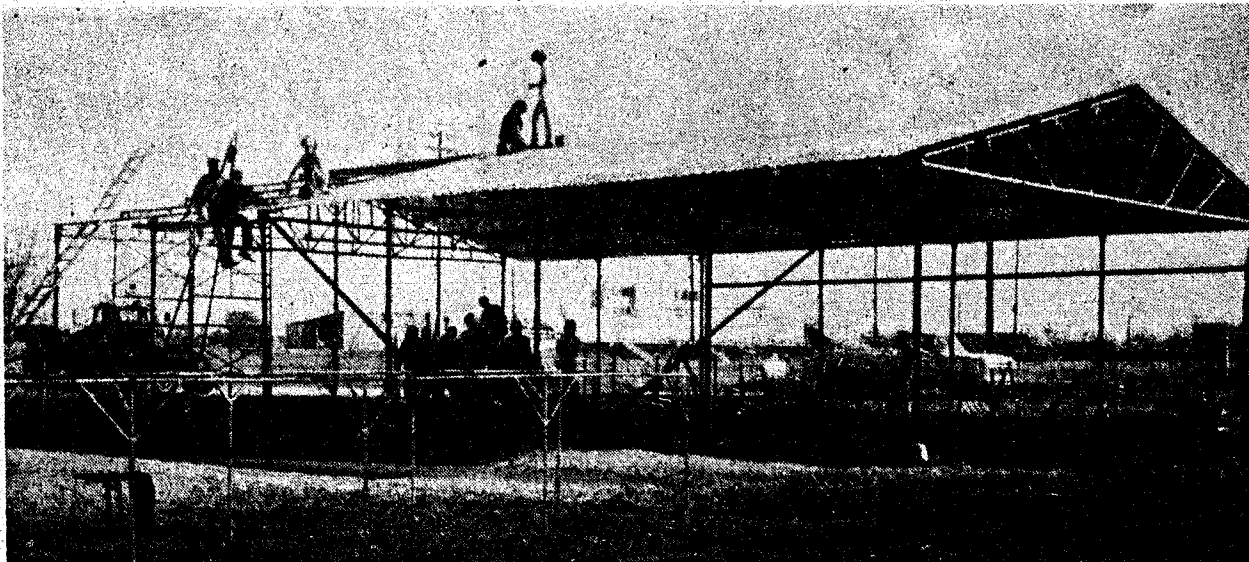

The Santa Anna City Library will be closed two additional days during the Christmas weekend.

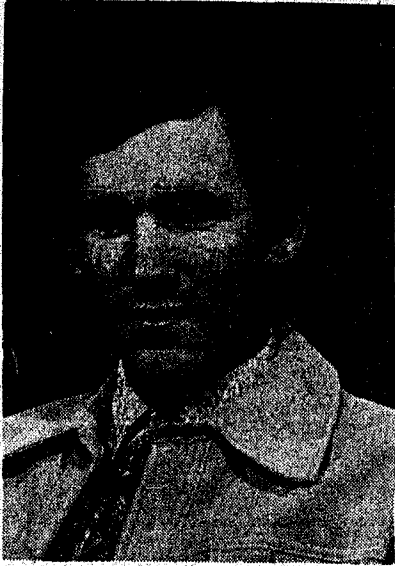
The City Library will not be open on Friday, December 22, or on Monday, Christmas Day.

## City Sales Tax Shows Increase

State Comptroller Bob Bullock announced last week that Texas cities will end 1978, receiving more than \$424.8 million as their share during the last 12 months of the local option one percent sales tax.

Santa Anna received \$2,916.81 for the period ending November 30, with the total for the 11 month period of 1978 being \$16,144.85. This is an 18 percent increase over the same period last year.

This is a 17.5 percent increase over 1977.

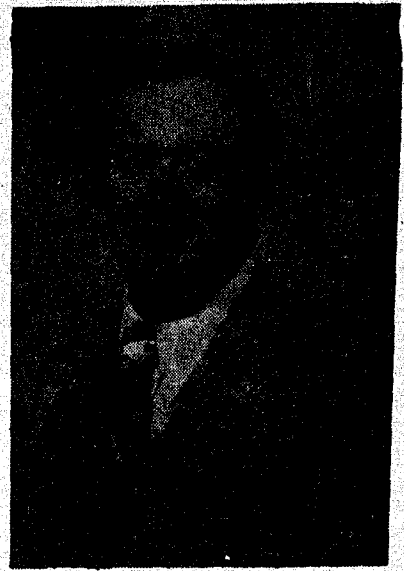
He is married to the former Brenda Roberts of Throckmorton. She teaches high

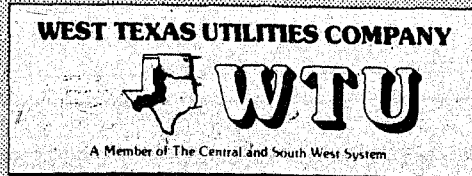

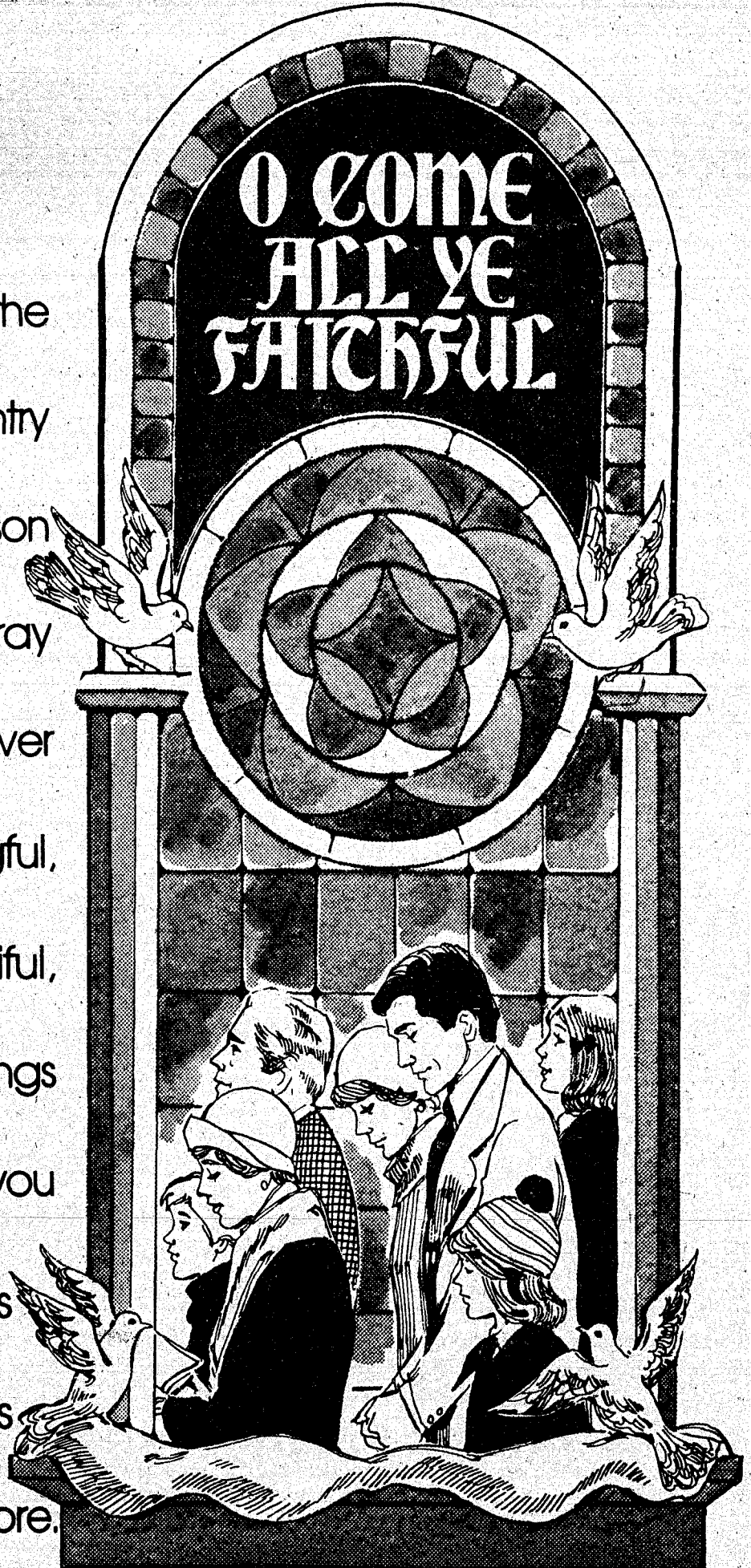

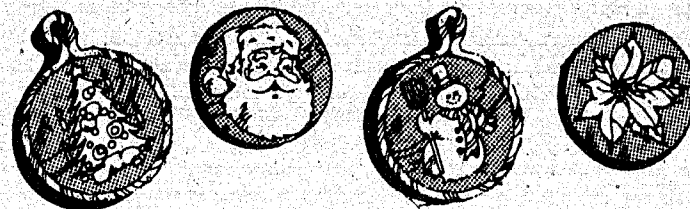

Apply a second coat of varnish and let dry again overnight. (Clean the varnish brush after you use it so it doesn't get hard). You now have a pretty waterproof coaster. A set of four makes a handsome gift!

If you want to make tree decorations, continue as follows: Glue colored yarn around edge of finished coaster. Cut a 5 inch piece of matching or other color yarn and glue onto back of coaster making a loop at the top. Now it's ready to hang on your tree or to give!

The Second Grade classes of Janet Neff and Linda Simmons presented a Christmas program at the December 12 meeting of Santa Anna Parent Teachers Association.

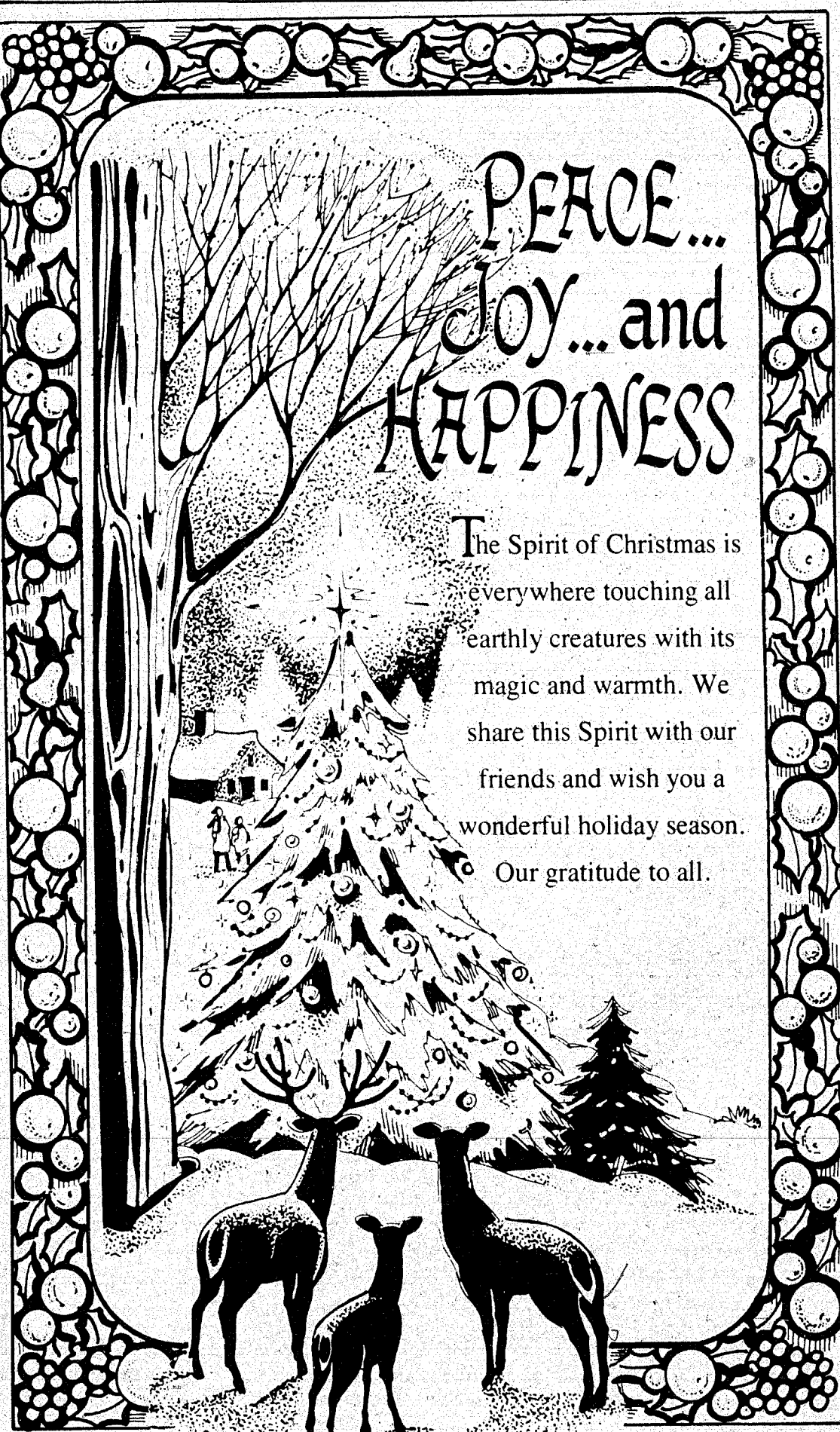

Local County Supervisor Tommy Hill has been transferred to Gatesville, effective January 15. Other office personnel in Coleman include Nelda Sampson, Mona Newman and Duane Jones, and decisions on those positions are uncertain at this time.

During the past three years the local office has handled FHA loans and grants in the two

counties in community improvement projects totaling more than \$8 million, in addition to the individual loans.

It is not known whether the FmHA will maintain a local part-time office in Coleman or send a representative there on scheduled appointments, but the full-time staffed office will be discontinued.

The office opened in Coleman in the 1930's as the Farm Security Administration, operating primarily in assistance to farmers in buying farms on long term, low interest schedules. Later the agency name was changed to Farmers Home Administration and in recent years has been very active in community improvement projects.
