Former S-Anna Resident Killed In Abilene Accident

Michael Dean Edwards, 17, son of a former Santa Anna band director, died Sunday, June 24, as a result of injuries received in a Saturday night motorcycle accident in Abilene. Also injured in the mishap was a night. 17-year-old companion, Marshall was in critical condition in an Abilene hospital Monday.

Known here as Mike, the youth was the son of the late Aubrey Edwards and Lu Monday and Tuesday Edwards who lived in Santa Anna several years. Mr. Edwards, a Methodist minister, died October 17, 1977.

Tragedy struck the Edwards family in 1970 when their young son, David, was struck and killed by an auto in Zephyr where Edwards was serving as pastor of the Methodist Church.

Survivors are his mother, Lu Edwards of Abilene; a sister, Adriane, also of Abilene; and his

maternal grandfather, Cook of Waxahachie.

Mike's grandmother, Mrs. O. W. Cook, suffered a heart attack and died while being notified of the young man's death Sunday
