Tax Appraisal Board Named For Coleman Co.

County Clerk Glen Thomas has recently announced the election of five directors for the Coleman County Tax Appraisal District that will be established January 1, 1980. Selection of the five directors was by the taxing entities in Coleman County that includes the school districts, county and the cities of Santa Anna and Coleman.

The new group, established under the recent Senate Bill 621 for tax reform in Texas, will organize a single appraisal district for Coleman County. 
It is called Investment because that's what it really is. The members decide on a project they think can make money for the church. This money is not used locally, but to tell the story of Jesus in far away lands.




