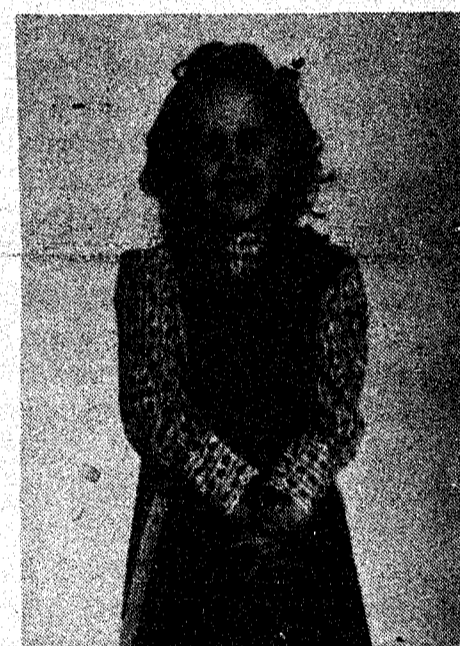
Jim Clifton led the scoring with 26, and Rusty Buzzard and Dwayne Warnock had 22 and 19 respectively.
